## Colby mother faces challenge after birth, death of husband

Samantha Rhodig, now 19, said she came from Texas as a fifth grader with her mother and family to live with her grandmother, Cathy

She described herself as a carefree and happy teenager when she met Dustin Rhodig, "the boy of her dreams." They fell in love. Like many young people, they dated, had fun and dreamed of a future

A growth had developed on Dustin's leg as a youngster, she said, but doctors thought it as "a growth spur." They gave it no further thought.

When he was 22, Samantha said,

The trauma from the accident apparently activated a tumor at the exact spot where the supposed growth spur had been located, she said.

The tumor grew quickly, and he was soon diagnosed with bone

The future looked uncertain for the young couple.

Dustin learned that if he kept his leg, he might have only six to eight months to live, but that if they could amputate it, he would have a year

Dustin underwent chemo and radiation, she said, but the effects of treatment took their toll on his blood count. And with a low blood count, surgery was no longer an option.

Through time-consuming decisions and doctors' appointments, the young couple had to put off marriage, she said, although Dustin desperately wanted to have a child.

Dustin's health continued to deteriorate, though, and he chose to spend his days at home to be near his wife and the baby. She stayed by his side 24 hours a day, seven days a week to care for him.

Dustin tried to hang on to see his son, she said, but that was not to be. He died at home on Nov. 10.

Samantha faced the end of her pregnancy with her grandmother by her side. Dustin II was born Dec. 16 with his daddy's dark hair and eyes, a mere 36 days after his father died.

Samantha says she's doing fine. She said she gets her strength to face each day from the dreams she and Dustin had for their son, and from her family, her friends and her faith in God.

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

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
