Cowboys lose big to Scott City, face Atwood tonight

Monday night at Scott City was in the first quarter and lost 76-26, hoping to rebound tonight against the Rawlins County Buffaloes at 7 p.m. at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The Cowboys with a 1-8 record will try to get back on the winning track tonight against the Rawlins County Buffaloes who have a 4-4 record.

On Thursday the Cowboys will open the annual Orange and Black Classic at 3:45 p.m. in the Colby Community Building against the Liberal Redskins with a 5-2 record

The Redskins lost to Hays on Friday 56-48 and tonight play Maize South of Wichita.

Coach Don Smith said it was a long game on Monday and said the Beavers showed why they have a good team.

He said the clock was not continuous in the fourth quarter because Scott City is not in the same league as Goodland this year and he did not talk to the coach and officials before the game.

"I decided we might as well play the whole thing to see if the boys could figure out how to score against a better team," he said. "They had a freshman (Drew Kite) who came in the fourth quarter and we couldn't stop him.

"I knew it was going to be a tough game. We gave up too many easy baskets and had too many turnovers again."

The Cowboys got the opening tip off, but the Beavers immediately stole the ball. The Cowboys got it back and Cowboy Garth Helton had the first shot, but it missed and Scott City got the rebound.

The Beavers started with a 9-0 run before Smith called a time out with 6:11 left in the first quarter. Scott City had an 11-0 lead before ing 6.6 per game and Cowan 6.2. the Cowboys got a basket.

Cowboy Robert Cowan scored another long, disappointing game and was fouled with 5 minutes left. for the Cowboys as they fell behind He missed the free throw making it 11-2.

Scott City went back on a scoring run to lead 20-2 before Cowan got his second basket to make it 20-4 with 2:30 left in the quarter. Helton hit a basket with one minute left to make it 27-6, and Brock Wilkens hit two free throws with less than 30 seconds left to make it 29-8. The Beavers hit the last shot with 20 seconds left to finish the quarter leading 31-8.

The second quarter was a bit better for the Cowboys as they scored 11 points, but fell further behind with the Beavers scoring 22 to lead 53-19 at half.

In the third quarter the Beavers added 12 points while the Cowboys were blanked with zero points. The score was 65-19 going into the final
