## Cowgirls take third place at Colby tournament

The Cowgirls came home with third place from the 25th annual Paul Wintz and Tom Bowen Orange and Black Classic at Colby with a victory over Liberal on Saturday afternoon, 46-39.

The Cowgirls won their first game playing the rival Colby Lady Eagles on Thursday, 38-27. In their second game the Cowgirls lost to the Pine Creek Lady Eagles, 45-39. Paige Phillips was unable to play due to an elbow injury.

Liberal went on to score a twopoint and a three-point shot. The score was Liberal, 19-14. One of Liberal's player made two fouls in a row giving Himger the chance at the charity stripe.
