# Onion plant order in, seed catalogs studied

The onion plant order is in the mail, the seed catalogs have been thoroughly studied and one of the tires on the rototiller is flat. My gardening season is officially under way! Yeah, I know. It's way too early to get excited since it will be at least two months before I plant a single seed outside, but that has absolutely nothing to do with the preparation necessary to get things off on the right foot. Octogenarians must begin preparation for the season much earlier than normal people because it takes just a bit longer to put things together.

And so, I am putting together my seed order for the things I will not find on the seed rack locally. Each year, I make an effort to plant a new variety of tomato as I continually search for something that I might find to be superior to the varieties that I planted the year before. Last year, my plants consisted of Northern Exposure, Super Tasty (which was my top producer last year), Big Beef, Super Fantastic, 4th of July and the new Sweet Seedless. This year, I will drop the Super Fantastic and the Sweet Seedless and try a new offering called Prime Beef Goliath. The Goliath is from a company called Totally Tomatoes, which, strangely enough, offers

they begun to sell some of the other several great varieties of cucumber, things, including lots of pepper seed and lots of started plants. More about them later.

a trade-marked family of 14 different Goliaths which features mostly tomatoes and now dozens of different pepper varieties. A few of the Goliaths have been available for awhile but this will be my first time to try them. The Prime Beef Goliath offers all kind of disease resistance (VFFTSt) and is a 70 day tomato, about the same as Northern Exposure. Large eight to 10 ounce fruit and indeterminate vines are listed as probabilities, as well as outstanding tomato flavor. We'll see. I have chosen not to plant the highly heralded seedless tomato again. The vines were absolutely overwhelming and the fruit was very small. Yeah, it was seedless, which I felt was not a great asset.
