# Mazie P. Sutton

Longtime Goodland, Kansas resident Mazie P. Sutton, 91, died Monday, February 1, 2010, at Goodland Regional Medical

She was born April 13, 1918, in Stockton, Kansas, the youngest of four daughters born to Edward and Monna (Chandler) Sutton. The family moved to Goodland on November 11, 1918. Mazie attended grade school and high school in Goodland, graduating from Goodland High School with the class of 1936. She attended the University of Wyoming and received a normal diploma in 1939. She taught in one-room schools in Granger and Big Piney, Wyoming. She attended the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colorado, and later taught fourth grade in Limon, Colorado. She joined the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps in 1943, serving with the WAC for three years during World War II at Ft. Des Moines, Iowa. In 1947, she graduated from the University of Northern Colorado with a Bachelor's Degree, and began teaching school at Cody, Wyoming. In 1960, she received a Master's Degree at the University of Wyoming, and then she taught as an assistant professor of elementary education at the University of Wyoming for nine years. She then moved to Casper, Wyoming and taught there for four years. Other schools at which she furthered her education included Colorado State University in Fort Collins, Colorado; Arizona State University in Tempe, Arizona; University of Massachusetts in Amherst, Massachusetts.

In 1976, Mazie moved back to Goodland and taught school at Kanorado for seven years. The Kanorado School was closed in 1983, and she retired from teaching that year, after thirtynine years. She volunteered as a teacher's aide, working with Sandra Burr for twentyone years, and as a member of Goodland Regional Medical Center Auxiliary, serving for thirty years. She was a dedicated volunteer to the Goodland Cemetery, making sure that the graves of veterans were marked
