Cowgirls win in overtime, 66-64

This was the first time this season for the Cowgirls to win two in a row, beating the Oberlin Red Devils, 56-50, on Tuesday night at Oberlin. The season record for the Cowgirls is 9-7.

The Cowgirls hope to extend their winning streak to three at their game at 5:30 p.m. tonight against the St. Francis Indians at St. Francis.

The Cougars put two baskets on the scoreboard early in the first quarter. At 6:36 Ashley Archer made two from the charity stripe making the score Burlington, 4-2.
