

Cowboys win close one over St. Francis, 50-47

Winning for the Cowboys getting wins has been tough, but Friday the team held off an Indian surge in the final minutes to win a close one 50-47.

The win raised the Cowboys season record to 4-15. On Friday the Cowboys will play at 7 p.m. against Oakley (11-5) at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

Coach Don Smith said he was proud of the effort of the team. He said the boys played aggressively and good had defense to overcome the height factor of the Indians.

The Indians struck first with a 3-point basket, but the Cowboys stayed close with four lead changes in the quarter with St. Francis leading 8-6 at the end of the quarter.

The second quarter had two ties and four lead changes with the Cowboys tying and taking a lead only to have the Indians tie the score again and take a one point lead on one of their 3-point shots. The teams traced baskets and the lead until the last two minutes when the Indians hit two 3-point baskets to lead 22-16 at the half.

Starting the third quarter the Cowboys went on a 7 point run with baskets by Brock Wilkens, Blaine Luther and a 3-point shot by Ryan

Hillmer to take a 23-22 lead.

The Indians retook the lead and on another 3-point shot had a 29-25 lead.

Hillmer cut the lead to 29-28 with another 3-point shot, and he hit two free throws and another 3-point basket to give Goodland at 33-29 lead. Reed Bellamy hit a basket to make it 35-31 with under one minute left.

The Indians came back to take a 35-34 lead with a basket and another 3-point shot with 20 seconds left.

At the buzzer Bellamy hit a 3-point shot to give the Cowboys a 38-36 lead at the end of three quarters.

The Cowboys got a basket by Luther and two free throws by Dillon Trachsel to take a 42-36 lead.

The Indians hit another 3-point shot to cut it to 42-39, but Luther gave the Cowboys a little breathing room with a basket and Robert Cowan hit a basket to make it 46-39 with about one minute left.

The Indians came back with a 3-point basket and a basket to cut it to 46-44 with 38 seconds left.

Hillmer hit two free throws to make it 48-44, but the Indians hit another 3 point basket to cut it to 48-47.

With under 10 seconds left

Hillmer hit two more free throws to make it 50-47, and the Indians were unable to score to give the Cowboys the win.

Wilkens had 2 points in the first half, Cowan 8 and Luther 6.

Hillmer had a game high 15 including 3 3-point baskets, three field goals and was 6 for 6 on free throws.

Luther had 12 on his six shots from the field for a 100 percent shooting percentage.

Cowan was the third Cowboy in double figures with 10 on five field goals.

Bellamy had 7 including his key 3-point shot a the buzzer at the end of the third quarter.

Wilkens had 4, but with foul trouble spent quite a bit of the game on the bench.

Trachsel had 2 on free throws.

Kevin Amthor and David Murray played, but did not score.

The Cowboys hit 49 percent from the floor, 4 of 9 from 3-point range and were 100 percent from the charity stripe hitting 8 of 8.

Cowan led the team in rebounds with 7. The Cowboys had 19 rebounds with 12 defensive and 7 offensive.

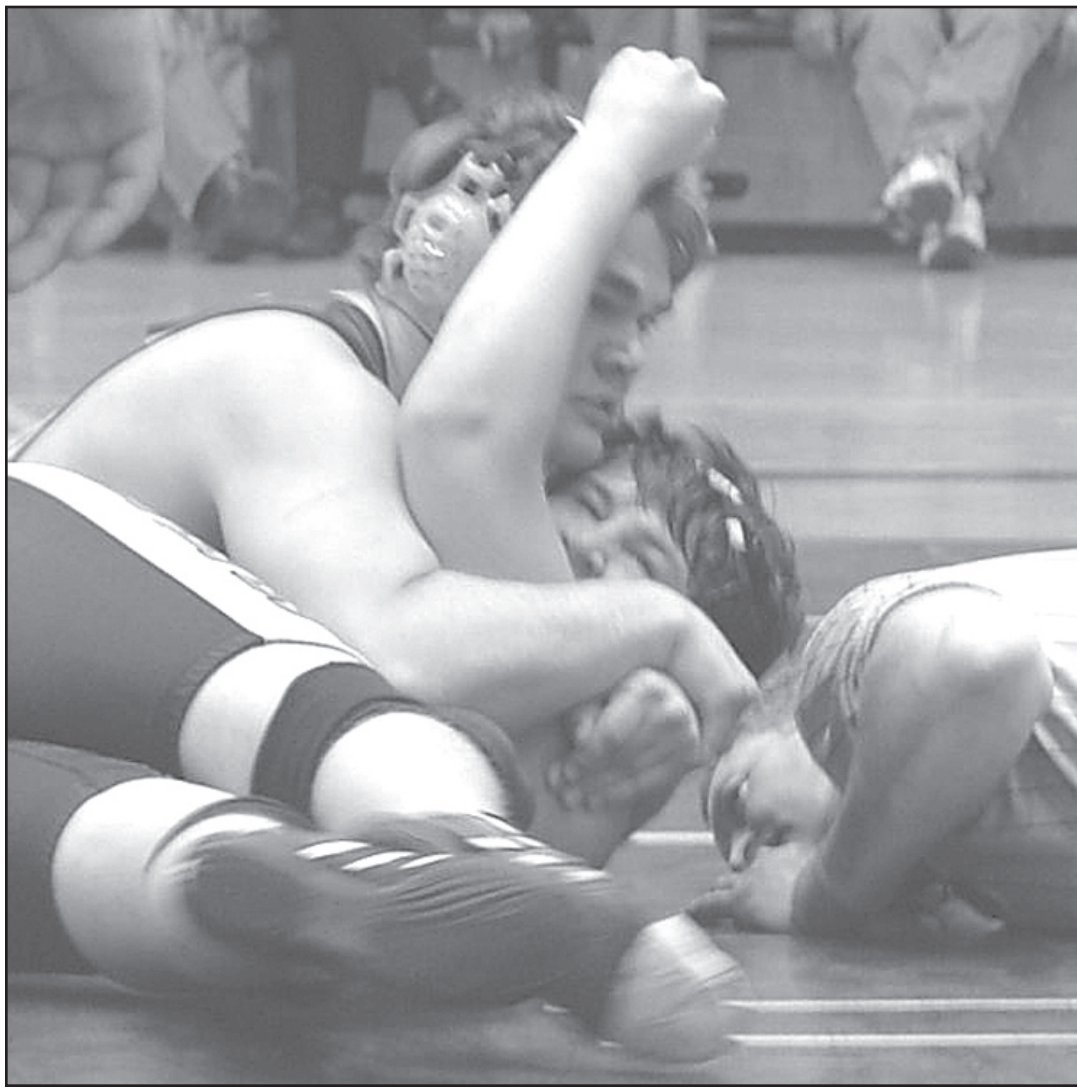
