Lydia Pauline Hilt

Lydia Pauline Hilt, 92, St. Francis, mother of Helen (Lawrence) Musil of Goodland, died Tuesday, Feb. 9, 2010.

She was born on Aug. 15, 1917, to Gottlieb and Christina (Docktor) Lippert in Cassia County, Idaho. The family moved to Cheyenne County in 1920 and she attended Clough Valley Country School.

Mrs. Hilt worked for numerous families in the tri-state area, cooking, cleaning, baking and caring for their children.

On Oct. 24, 1943, she and Henry "John" Hilt were married at Salem Lutheran Church of rural St. Francis. The couple first lived in rural Yuma County, Colo., and in March 1946 they moved to a farm 25 miles southwest of St. Francis. In September 1998 they moved into St. Francis.

Mrs. Hilt had crescent rolls, long johns and cinnamon rolls for visiting grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She raised large gardens and an accomplished seamstress.

She taught Bible School and Sunday School for both children and adults. As her children grew up she became very active in WELCA.

Mrs. Hilt made soap, layettes and quilts for Lutheran World Relief. Although she had lost her sight she continued making quilts with the assistance of her many needle-threaders (anyone who came to the house when the thread had broken).

Preceding her in death were her parents; her husband, John; three brothers, Gottlieb Lippert, Jake Lippert and Rudy Lippert; four sisters, Christina Schritter, Anna Lippert, Edna Walz and Martha Knodel; and two sons-in-law, Dean Weir and Bill Stenzel.

Survivors include a son, Harvey Hilt of Paola; two other daughters, Margaret Wier of Monument, Colo., and Carol Stenzel of Kansas City, Mo.; a sister, Ruth Knodel of Bethune, Colo.; 26 grandchildren; and 21 great-grandchildren.

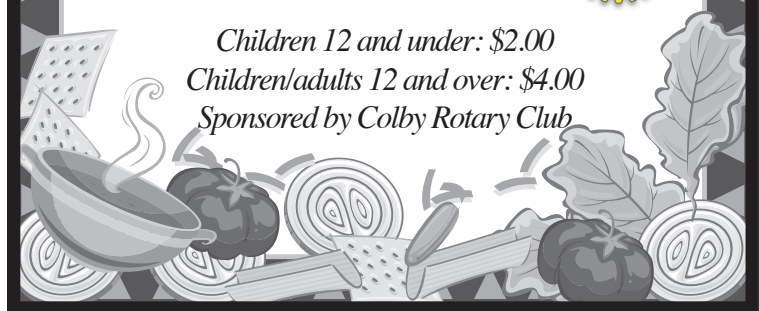
