

Cowboys at Oakley for tune up for regionals

The Cowboys wrestling team was in Oakley Thursday for their final dual matches before regionals next weekend at Norton.

Coach Joe Sramek said the Oakley dual will be a good tune up before the team competes at regionals.

"Oakley has some really good kids on their squad," he said. "The junior varsity will compete in the Colby Novice tournament on Saturday, which will be their last competition of the year."

As for regional at Norton Coach Sramek said the field will include six of the top 10 state ranked teams in 3-2-1A wrestling.

Those teams include Norton, Phillipsburg, Hoxie, Goodland, Oakley and Plainville. Many of the weights will have 6 or 7 kids who are State Quality wrestlers, he said, unfortunately only four wrestlers in each weight will make it to state the next weekend.

The regional tournament will start at 1 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 19, and the teams will wrestle up to the Semi Finals. On Saturday the tournament will begin at 10 a.m.

"It will be an exiting weekend of wrestling with some of the best wrestlers in the state competing," he said, "and it will be fun to watch how things come out with all good wrestlers participating in the tournament."

"I felt our JV did an excellent job in their matches with Colby," Sramek said. "We won seven out of the 10 JV matches."
