## Rotary delivers old school books to Manhattan

Goodland Rotary Club members collected books that were being replaced from the Goodland School District in the summer, and about nine months later the books have been moved to Manhattan for shipment overseas.

Fred Hall, Rotary president, said the books have been delivered to the Manhattan

armory. He said the "Help us Learn... Give us Hope!" organization will use the books to reestablish libraries for schools at all levels in Iraq and Afghanistan.

As of January he said the group has distributed 310,000 pounds of donated supplies and 304,000 donated books to more than 600,000 students.

The shipments go directly to soldiers who distribute them to the children in need.

The objective of the program is to strengthen the bond between Iraqi and Afghan children, their families and American soldiers, thereby enhancing the soldiers mission in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Hall said Cochran Farm Supply do-

minated the enclosed trailer used to deliver the books.

Dick and Sherlyn Liess, Trevor and Sarah Linton and family and Matt and Jared Hall loaded the trailer for delivery. For several of the volunteers, this was the second or third time they had loaded and unloaded the books.

The Goodland books were delivered to the Manhattan Armory on March 8, by Hall and his son Matt. He said they were met at the armory by Gary LaGrange who is the area coordinator with "Help us Learn... Give us Hope!"

## Barbershop chorus to have concert, guest appearances

This dynamic foursome has been electrifying audiences around the world for 20 years. Acoustix has appeared on CNN, NBC's "Today Show," TNN's "The Statler Brothers Show," and two PBS specials. At the turn of the 21st century, Acoustix performed for a global audience of 175 million viewers on "ABC 2000," hosted by Peter Jennings.
