

# Wrestlers bring five medals back from Topeka

Goodland Wrestling Club members brought five medals back from the state Folkstyle Championships over the weekend held in Topeka.

Goodland had one third place finisher and four with fourth place medals from the 16 who went to the tournament. Goodland finished 55 out of 168 teams in the tournament with 23 points.

Tayton Weeter placed third in the 70 pound class in the 8 and under division.

Luis Ledesma placed fourth in the 150 pounds class in the 10 and under division.

Ian Bonsall placed fourth in the 165 pound class in the 14 and under division.

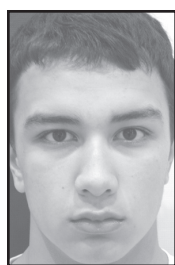
In the high school division Seth Miller finished fourth in the 130 pound class and Lorenzo Delgado finished fourth in the 155 pound class.

The other Goodland wrestlers did not place, but all who participated learned a lot and worked hard to make the trip to Topeka, said Coach Poch Avelar.

Ledesma had three pins and ranked 10th in the tournament with a total time of 2:30.

The top wrestler with pins was Cameron Hughbanks of Maize with four pins in 3:22. Tucker Braum of Colby was 19th with three pins in 3:54.

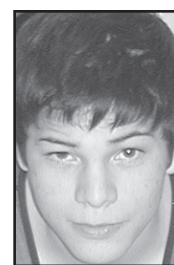
As a team Goodland ranked 13th with 13 pins in a total of 24:33. The

## Cowboys split with Ulysses

The Cowboys baseball team opened their season Thursday at Memorial Field splitting with Ulysses losing the first game 11-0 and winning the second 13-3 with both games ending after five innings.

Coach Devlin Mull said he was not sure how things were going to go after the Cowboys got shut out in the first game, but said the Cowboys shook it off and came back in the second game to win by the same margin as they lost in the first game.

"It was like the lowest low after the first game," he said, "but it was like winning a world series game after the second. I was afraid we were looking at a long season after the first game. We made a few errors in the second game, but they stepped up and made great plays to get us out of trouble."

"It was a good game. The guys forgot about the loss and came back and played hard."

Dallas DeLaRosa was starting pitcher for the first game and Ryan

Hillmer pitched the second game, Mull said.

Mull said DeLaRosa and Hillmer will be his main pitchers along with Reed Bellamy. He said he has six or seven who will probably pitch a little including Garth Helton, Cutter Issac, Austin Avelar and Michael Pettibone.

He said the other positions are still up in the air as he played Brook Redlin at first in the opening game.

"He plays everywhere for us," Mull said.

He said DeLaRosa will play some at first when he is not pitching, and will play some at third.

"I don't know who is going to be our mainstay first baseman," Mull said. "We kind of need one, but we have about five who can play there. The problem is we are not practicing two of them there enough so I really don't know who is going to be at first base."

Mull said Avelar will play second and Hillmer will play short stop when he is not pitching. At third will

be Devon Garrett and Ryder Kling will be catching. Kevin Amthor caught the second game against Ulysses, he said, and will play center field when not catching.

Issac played left field one game, Bellamy played right field one game and Pettibone played right one game. He said Teather Dautel was unable to play, but will be an outfielder for the team.

Mull said he has 18 guys out for the team, and that at least four of those on the bench can come in and play.

"If we are not producing we can bring them in to help," he said. "We have not had that in the past."

The next games will be at 3:30 p.m. on Tuesday, April 6 at Burlington.

Mull said he is glad about spring break for school, but it will mess up the baseball practice.

"I'm pretty excited about the season with these guys," he said. "I hope I don't get too overconfident."
