

Cowgirls split games with Liberal Lady Redskins

The Cowgirl softball team went into their game at Colby on Thursday with their first win of the season in the second game of a double header with Liberal, 8-6. They lost the first game after Liberal pulled ahead with a run in the top of the seventh inning, 6-5. The Cowgirls are 1-3 for the season.

Coach Tess Smith said the girls had a chance to win if they were able to hit the ball. She said the defense has been good.

In the first two Cowgirl games against Hays High the coach said the Cowgirls weren't able to hit the ball.

In the second game with Liberal in the first inning both teams had three up and three out. In the top of the second inning Liberal's Brooke Scheuerman hit a double and Emily Bayouth a single with both scoring. Goodland's Angie Hillmer hit a single and stole second and third. Katlyn Toppliff batted her in. Liberal lead 2-1.

In the top of the third Liberal had three up and three out. Paige Phillips and Tasha Gaydusek hit singles and scored. Kirsten Toppliff had a run batted in. Lexi David hit a single and scored. Hillmer hit a triple and was batted in by Sydnee Thornburg. Thornburg also scored. The score was Goodland, 6-2.

In the top of the fourth Liberal added two runs to their score. Phillips and Gaydusek added two runs to the Goodland's score. Goodland led, 8-4. Liberal added two more runs in the top of the fifth. The

Cowgirls were unable to add any more runs to the score in the game. Cowgirls won, 8-6. The winning pitcher was Ashley Archer.

In the first game with Liberal, Liberal didn't score in the top of the first inning. Kirsten Toppliff lead off for the Cowgirls and hit a single. Archer hit a double. Both scored a run. the score was Goodland, 2-0.

Neither team scored in the second inning. Liberal remained scoreless in the top of the third. Gaydusek hit a single and Archer batted her in with a sacrifice fly. Goodland led, 3-0.

Both Liberal and Goodland didn't add any runs in the fourth inning. Liberal made its first run of the game in the top of the fifth. Kirsten Toppliff walked at her turn at bat and scored after she stole home. Goodland led, 4-1.

Liberal added their second run in the top of the sixth. The score was Goodland, 4-2. Liberal added four runs in the top of the seventh inning to defeat the Cowgirls, 5-4. The losing pitcher was Archer.

In the Cowgirls' first game of the season with Hays High both teams remained scoreless until the bottom of the third when Hays had three runs. Hays added three more runs in the bottom of the fifth. Goodland was never able to score. Hays won 6-0. The losing pitcher was Archer.

In the second game with Hays High Cowgirls were still unable to score. Hays scored seven runs in the bottom of the first inning. They added runs in the second, third and fourth innings. Hays won 11-0.
