Son joins family at home in Wichita

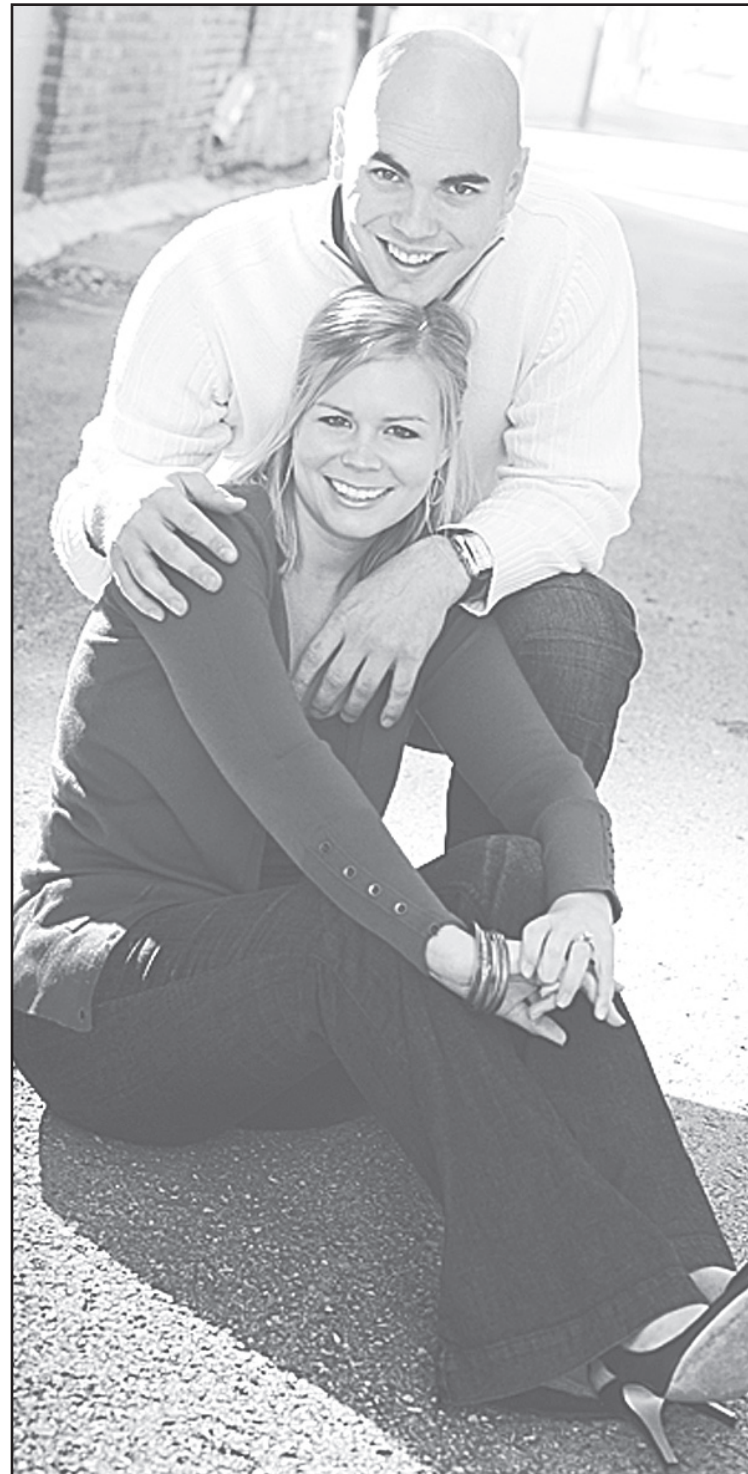
