# **Sports Cowboys win doubleheader at Burlington**

The Cowboys were to play at 3 and 5;30 p.m. in Scott City on Monday, and travel to Liberal for a doubleheader on Thursday.

The games at Burlington were make up from those postponed by weather from April 6.

The Cowboys won the first game 8-2, and Coach Devlin Mull said the boys played well. He said it was good to have Garth Helton throw a complete game.

In the second game the Cowboys won 11-9 with Ryan Hillmer throwing a complete game.

The Cowboys led 3--0 in the top of the first inning, but the Burlington Cougars came back in the bottom half to take a 5-3 lead on a 3-run home run.

In the second inning the Cowboys loaded the bases with one out, but a double play on a infield hit by Kevin Amthor ended the Cowboys scoring threat.

In the top of the third inning the Cowboys caught fire with Cowboy Austin Avelar hitting a 2-run batted in single to give Goodland a 6-5 lead.

The Cowboys continued with a single by Robert Cowan to move Avelar to third. Avelar scored on a Cougar error making it 7-5. Cowboy Kuter Isaac got a hit to score Cowan making it 8-5 with no outs.

Burlington made a pitching change, but Hillmer hit a shot to deep center for a double and scoring two runs to make it 10-5. A sacrifice fly by Amthor scored Hillmer to make it 11-5.



Ryder Kling grounded out, Dallas DeLaRosa drew a walk, but Brook Redlin hit to the third baseman to end the Cowboys rally. The Cow- ner off at first for the second out. The boys had scored 8 runs on 7 hits and next Cougar batter hit a deep fly to 3 Cougar errors.

In the bottom of the third the Cougars first hitter put one over the wall for a home run to make it 11-6. The next batter ground out.
