More vegetable and flower seeds will be carefully placed in the ground in the next couple of weeks than at any other time of the year. The garden soil has been freshly turned, the grass is growing and gardeners



everywhere are looking forward to another season of wheel barrow loads of home grown food and arm loads of beautiful flowers.

How about you? Are you going to join the increasing number of Americans who will make a genuine effort to plant, degrees and above, it's safe to plant cultivate, irrigate and harvest some of your own food and flower bouquets this year?

Actually, there is still plenty of time to prepare a garden plot or flower bed for planting.

The same goes for all the warm season vegetables such as green beans, squash, cucumbers, okra, sweet corn and peppers. I would wait until about May 15th to plant cantaloupe seed or set out sweet potato plants, both of which seriously dislike cool soil or cool air.
