"Can we do that?" Dechant said. Gerber said it would be like what the city does with weeds.

Commissioner Annette Fairbanks said she likes the idea because it would be ongoing.

Gerber said his was not the only idea, but he wanted to see what the city could do to help improve the looks of the community.

Billinger said he likes the idea of hiring a crew during the summer and have them clean up around town. He said maybe a high school student or two, or a college student with a city employee supervising.

City Clerk Mary Volk asked what the incentive is to clean up

year are we going to go through the process again.

Gerber said he would explore the idea and work out more details.

Daniels suggested getting a volunteer group and give them a credit against their utilities.

Dechant suggested an adopt-ablock program.

"I think these are all good ideas," Billinger said. "Out of the list of 43 there may be some that really need some volunteer help. Maybe organizations can pick specific families. The more ideas we have the better off we are."

"On the front end, if we give them \$200 worth of paint that is better than looking at a run down house," Gerber said.

He said he would work on a list of houses for the next meeting and work on details of the clean up to create a trial program.

However, these approximations are intended to reflect a good faith intent and estimation by Village Markets to permit the city to calculate the anticipated economic benefits the grocery will generate which would merit the incentives and accommodations

being extended. Commissioner Annette Fairbanks made the motion to approve

the incentive package and Dechant seconded.

Commissioner Rick Billinger asked if the city has a signed lease agreement and if this was the las piece of the puzzle for Mancini.

Gerber said he felt it was the last piece. He said Mancini had not indicated a specific time, but knows Mancini has been working to get the project going as soon as possible.

"I remember him (Mancini) saying he would try to get it done quickly," Billinger said, "or push it off to next spring.' Billinger asked if the incentives

were identical to what was in the city policy. Gerber said it was what we had

verbally approved, and it is what is in the incentive policy the commission had approved.

"It is the same as what the next guy might get," Billinger said.

Dechant said this agreement has some things that are specific to Mancini's business, but the majority are the same as anyone could apply for who was expanding or bringing in a new business.
