Nebraska team wins Levi Hayden tournament

Saturday was an unusual day – as baseball tournaments go-with clear skies in the morning when the tournament started at Memorial Field, in the afternoon winds and clouds came in to drop a bit of rain and cool things off before the North Platte Nationals won the championship game over Colby 13-2.

Andrew Armstrong of North Platte was named the most inspirational player of the tournament by the coaches, umpires and tournament officials.

At the opening of the first game between Goodland and Borders of Wray, Colo., the Levi Hayden Memorial Scholarship was presented to Goodland's Kevin Amthor by Bill and Rhonda Hayden. The tournament and scholarship are named for their son Levi who died in an accident on Feb. 21, 1997.

The Nationals reached the championship game by defeating Colby 10-0 in the first game while Goodland defeated Borders 9-1 to reach the semi-finals.

In the semi-finals North Platte defeated the Outlaws 18-9 to reach the championship.

The Nationals were in command early in the championship and won 13-2.

Goodland Coach John Dautel said the Outlaws played a great first game against Wray and did not have any errors, but that was not the case in the next two games as the Outlaws fell behind and could not manufacture enough runs to pull out a win.

Strong winds blowing north across the field helped several hits make it over the fence for home runs. Dautel said Ty Baker of the Nationals had four home runs, and there were a total of eight or nine in the tournament, he said.
