

Goodland swimmers win league championship

The Goodland Swim Team finished the season by winning the two day Northwest Kansas Swim League Championship with 340 points on Saturday at Colby. Four swimmers were league champions and 14 won trophies for placing the top six for the season.

Devinee Borgmann (9-10 girls) won the trophy for league champion with 35 points, winning all five of her races. She also placed first for the season in the 100-yard freestyle (1:18.34), 25-yard freestyle (14.59), 25-yard backstroke (17.91), 25-yard butterfly (17.27) and the 100-yard individual medley (1:24.68).

Taryn Bedore (13-14 girls) also won five gold medals with 35 and placing first for the season going undefeated in the 200-yard freestyle (2:27.33), 100-yard freestyle (1:04.32), 50-yard freestyle (27.53), 100-yard butterfly (1:08.84) and 200-yard individual medley (2:42.07).

Ian Bonsall (13-14 boys) won three individual races the 200-yard freestyle (2:22.87), 100-yard freestyle (57.74) and 50-yard freestyle (57.74). He placed second in two events to take home the league trophy and was third for the season.

Powell Sieck (9-10 boys) was the league champion with two wins and a third, fourth and sixth place. He was third for the season. He won the 25-yard backstroke (20.34) and the 25-yard butterfly (19.86).

Others winning a trophy for the season were Rachel Witman (8 and under girls) third, Jared Stoffel (8 and under boys) fourth, Mikayla Stoffel (9-10 girls) sixth, Levi House (9-10 boys) first, Peyton Sieck (9-10 boys) fifth, Dusty Johnson (11-12 boys) third, Hagan Hoss (11-12 boys)

fourth, Holton Witman (13-14 boys) second, Zach Miller (13-14 boys) fourth and Gerell Miller (13-14 boys) sixth.

Those swimmers winning first place were Levi House (9-10 boys) 100-yard freestyle (1:21.31) and 100-yard individual medley (1:42.27); Rachel Witman (8 and under girls) 25-yard backstroke (21.59), Peyton Sieck (9-10 boys) 25-yard freestyle (15.82); Holton Witman (13-14 boys) 100-yard backstroke (1:19.14); and Zach Miller (13-14 boys) 100-yard breaststroke (1:19.14).

The 13-14 boys won the 200-yard freestyle relay (1:50.35) with Bonsall, Gerell Miller, Zach Miller and Holton Witman swimming and the 200-yard medley relay (2:20.47) with Bonsall, Zach Miller, Holton Witman and Ace Arteaga swimming.

Other relay winners were 8 and under mixed 100-yard medley (2:02.55) with Rebecca Lockhart, Jared Stoffel, Rachel Witman and Gantzen Miller swimming; 9-10 girls 100-yard medley (1:20.83) with Chalee Luther, Mikayla Stoffel, Borgmann and Ellee McDaniel swimming; and 9-10 boys 100-yard freestyle (1:10.61) with Ryan Volk, Peyton Sieck, Chase Johnson and Powell Sieck swimming.

In 8 and under girls Rachel Witman was third in the 100-yard individual medley (1:58.99), third in the 25-yard freestyle (81.78) and third in the 25-yard butterfly (24.22) and Peri Sieck was fourth in the 50-yard freestyle (45.95), sixth in the 25-yard freestyle (19.83) and fourth in the 25-yard butterfly (25.20).

In 8 and under boys Jared Stoffel was second in the 100-yard individual medley (2:29.31), fourth in the 25-yard butterfly (36.42) and third in the 25-yard breaststroke

(27.88) and Ethan McDaniel was sixth in the 25-yard breaststroke (28.04).

In 9-10 girls Mikayla Stoffel was sixth in the 100-yard individual medley (1:49.87) and third in the 25-yard breaststroke (22.25) and Chalee Luther fourth in the 25-yard breaststroke (22.78).

The 9-10 girls 100-yard freestyle relay team was third (1:14.03) with Mikayla Stoffel, Hannah Eslinger, Borgmann and Luther swimming.

In 9-10 boys Peyton Sieck was third in the 100-yard individual medley (1:45.90), third in the 100-yard freestyle (1:28.32) and second in the 25-yard butterfly (21.68); Powell Sieck fourth in the 100-yard medley (1:47.71), sixth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:33.17) and third in the 25-yard freestyle (16.09); and Chase Johnson sixth in 25-yard butterfly (24.47).

The 9-10 boys 100-yard medley was fourth (1:34.55) with Powell Sieck, Ryan Volk, Peyton Sieck and Chase Johnson swimming.

The 9-10 mixed 100-yard freestyle team was second (1:38.05) with Ellee McDaniel, Jared Stoffel, Gantzen Miller and Ethan McDaniel swimming.

In 11-12 boys Dusty Johnson was third in the 100-yard individual medley (1:28.40), third in the 100-yard freestyle (1:14.02), second in the 200-yard freestyle (2:53.53), third in the 50-yard freestyle (32.00) and fourth in the 50-yard butterfly (43.94); Hagan Hoss fifth in the 100-yard individual medley (1:36.13), fifth in the 200-yard freestyle (3:02.09), fifth in the 50-yard freestyle (33.40), second in the 50-yard backstroke (42.27) and second in the 50-yard butterfly (40.43); Drew House fifth in the 100-yard

freestyle (1:20.12), third in the 200-yard freestyle (2:53.96) and third in the 50-yard butterfly (40.77); and Simon Bassett sixth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:20.46), fifth in the 50-yard backstroke (45.23) and sixth in the 50-yard breaststroke (50.05).

The 11-12 boys 100-yard freestyle relay was second (2:20.56) with Dusty Johnson, Simon Bassett, Drew House and Hoss swimming.

The 11-12 boys 200-yard medley was second (2:48.94) with Simon Bassett, Dusty Johnson, Drew House and Hoss swimming.

The 11-12 mixed 200-yard freestyle relay was fourth (2:47.90) with Kinsey Volk, Luke Hamilton, Paetyn Barriclow and Sianna Miller swimming.

The 11-12 mixed 200-yard medley was third (3:44.30) with Barriclow, Kinsey Volk, Sianna Miller and Luke Hamilton swimming.

In 13-14 girls Makala Fogg was fourth in the 400-yard freestyle (7:00.46) and fifth in the 100-yard butterfly (1:43.31) and Savannah Bassett was sixth in the 100-yard butterfly (1:44.64).

The 13-14 girls 200-yard freestyle relay was second (2:23.03) with Bedore, Fogg, Savannah Bassett and Rachel Horney swimming.

The 13-14 girls 200-yard medley was second (2:42.24) with Horney, Savannah Bassett, Bedore and Fogg swimming.

In 13-14 boys Bonsall was second in the 400-yard freestyle (5:19.02) and second in the 100-yard backstroke (1:15.40); Holton Witman second in the 100-yard freestyle (59.94) and second in the 50-yard freestyle (25.44); Zach Miller third in the 200-yard

individual medley (2:45.66), third in the 400-yard freestyle (5:52.41), third in the 200-yard freestyle (2:36.57) and third in the 50-yard freestyle (27.94); Gerell Miller fifth in the 200-yard individual medley (3:01.77), fourth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:07.40), sixth in the 50-yard freestyle (29.08), third in the 100-yard backstroke (1:21.49) and second in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:23.94); Alec Hamilton fifth in the 100-yard butterfly (1:07.50), fifth in the 50-yard freestyle (28.68) and fifth in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:39.80); Arteaga fourth in the 400-yard freestyle (6:37.84) and fifth in the 100-yard butterfly (1:47.62); and Aaron Avelar fifth in the 100-yard backstroke (1:40.05) and sixth in the 100-yard butterfly (1:53.81).

The 13-14 mixed 100-yard freestyle was third (2:19.83) with Alec Hamilton, Kennedy, Avelar and Arteaga swimming.

The 13-14 mixed 200-yard medley was third (2:44.94) with Gerell Miller, Kennedy, Avelar and Alec Hamilton swimming.

In 15-18 girls Brooke Lockhart was fifth in the 400-yard freestyle (6:06.37).

In 15-18 boys Timothy Fugleberg was fifth in the 100-yard backstroke (1:55.01).

Other swimmers were Olivia Bassett, Montana Noffsinger and Shayley Miller.

The Colby Swim Club came in second at league competition with 278 points, Wray Swim Club third with 246, Oberlin Swim Club fourth with 207, Burlington Swim Team fifth with 193, Holyoke Swim Club sixth with 139, Flagler seventh with 52 and Oakley eighth with 50.
