The maker of the nuggets was Perdue Farms, Inc. of Perry, Ga. They are recalling about 91,872 pounds of the product that was produced on June 9, 2010.

The company discovered small

pieces of blue plastic after receiving consumer complaints. There have been no reports of injury.

Duell said the carnival people have been busy this year with a variety of projects, and some annual maintenance.

New skirting on Tilt-A-Whirl where they replaced the old wooden skirting with metal frame and plastics.

Repairing Octopus cars. Painted the Lions ride cars with the carnival and Lions club partnering to repaint the cars.

This is along with the many small repairs that have been made to be sure each ride is safe.

"Members of the carnival board and individual volunteers have been working most Wednesday nights throughout the year making repairs and building new items," he said.

The group purchased a Telehandler this year to help with ride assembly and any repairs, he said.

The Goodland Kiwanis club

has been working this summer to expand the Kiwanis Shack on the east end of the 4-H building. The expansion was tested during Freedom Fest and the Kiwanis members said it went well, but there were a few more changes that needed to be made before the fair.

The expansion doubles the number of windows for people to turn in orders and pick up their great Kiwanis burgers and other menu items.

Testing the expanded windows kept the Kiwanis cooks busy during Freedom Fest. Kiwanis member and Governor Brad Schields said he felt it went well, and thinks people will find it a great improvement during the fair days and nights.

The Sherman County home owned carnival will open on Saturday evening after the Northwest Kansas District Free Fair Parade and at 7 p.m. each night of the fair Monday through Friday. Wrist band nights will be Tuesday and Friday with all rides costing \$10 and \$5 for the kids rides.

For the regular nights it will be 50¢ per ticket with most rides taking two tickets.
