## Support of breast feeding encouraged

This year's theme is "Breast- of life." feeding; Just 10 Steps! The "Ten Step" theme commemorates the 20th anniversary of the Innocenti Declaration developed by the World Health Organization and the United Nations Children's Fund. This document calls for the implementation of the Baby-Friendly Ten Steps in all maternity facilities to support breastfeeding.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment encourages the benefits of breastfeeding and its important, positive long term effects on the growth and development of infants.

"We promote breastfeeding during the first six months of infancy and longer," said Roderick Bremby, secretary of the department. "It is the best way an infant can obtain the nutritional and emotional re-

UNICEF estimates that more than six million babies are saved every vear worldwide through exclusive breastfeeding. Even in developed countries such as the U.S., breastfeeding saves infants and drastically reduces health care costs. An online study published in the journal "Pediatrics" in April reported the lives of 900 babies and billions of dollars in health care costs would be saved each year in the United States if 90 percent of United States women breastfed their infants for the first

six months of life. director of health. "In addition to the benefits for infants, breastfeeding is also a benefit to mothers by advancing the recovery from postpartum depression and decreasing the risk of ovarian, uterine and endometrial cancers, as well as anemia, diabetes and osteoporosis.'

Research shows that implementation of just some of the 10 steps recommended for maternity facilities improve breastfeeding initiation and duration rates. The Ten Steps recommended are:

• Have a written breastfeeding policy

· Train healthcare staff in neces-• Inform pregnant women about

the benefits and management of breastfeeding • Help mothers initiate breast-

 Show mothers how to breastfeed and maintain lactation

• Give newborn infants no food or drink other than breast milk unless medically indicated

• Practice 24 hour rooming-in • Encourage breastfeeding on

demand Give no artificial teats or pacifiers

• Refer mothers to support groups on discharge from the facility
