Survey team south on K-27

Beginning on Monday, and continuing for about six weeks, a survey team from the Kansas Department of Transportation will start surveying along K-27 Highway in Wallace County.

The survey crew will begin near the south city limits of Sharon Springs and continue south approximately 5 miles. The survey is starting earlier than expected said Kim Huxman of KDOT, who will be in charge of the survey.

The field survey is intended to gather information necessary for the detailed design of proposed improvements (funds permitting) along the highway through the curves south of Sharon Springs.

Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor. The placing of plastic targets on the ground for aerial photo identification may be used. When it becomes necessary for crew mem-

bers to enter private property, they will first obtain permission from the landowner or tenant.
