have a check for \$497 and need to figure out what I can do."

Mayor Josh Dechant thanked Soper for coming to talk to the commissioners. He said the city commission and staff are trying to get the city cleaned up and feel that starts with Main. He said the stuff on the sidewalk got it all going.

"If you work on it and keep trying we will work with you," Dechant said.

"I did not buy three buildings on Main to let them get worse," Soper said. "I have tried to get the building done, and cleaned up the front of the building. I have taken over three buildings that no one wanted.

"I can now get around in the building. I will be replacing the glass, but it will take some time. I am going to split the window into two pieces. I will try to get the window fixed as well."

Chief James said Soper is doing a good job and working on cleaning up the problems.

Brent Wood talked to the commissioners about the upcoming Flatlander Festival and how things are going.

He asked for permission to use the street, much like last year, and plan to do the picnic in Chambers Park on Sunday.

He said there may not be a golf tournament as no one has stepped up to take that over. He said they want to add a motorcycle and auto swap meet, and will give that a try.

Events are on schedule with the motorcycle group and auto club, he said. He asked about the city covering the electrical costs and providing bleachers for the tractor-pull and the show at Chambers Park.

Jeff Mills, engineer for Evans, Bierly, Hutchison and Associates, said he was not sure what the details of the change were, but would get that information.

Gerber said he knew some of the changes had to do with traffic control.
