

# Cowboys begin practice, in pads on Thursday



## Cowboys start year on Sept. 3

The Cowboys football team began practice this week, and will hold a soap scrimmage at 6:15 p.m. on Friday, Aug. 27.

The Goodland Cross Country team, Cowgirls Volleyball and Cowgirls Golf teams have started practice.

The Cowboys football team will open the season on the road at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 3, at Houghton. The first home games will be on Friday Sept. 10, with Ulysses coming to Cowboys Stadium.

The Cowgirls golf team will open at Hugoton on Thursday, Sept. 2.

The Cowgirls will hold a tournament at 2 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 7, at Sugar Hills Golf Course.

The Cowgirls volleyball team will hold a quad beginning at 3:45 p.m. on Sept. 7.

The Cross Country teams both high school and junior high will begin with a home meet at 4 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 2, at Sugar Hills Golf Course.



The Goodland Cowboys football team began practicing this week and Monday was a cool morning as Don Raymer, assistant coach, put the team through a series of run defense drills (above left). At the end of the drills Raymer got a bit sneaky (above) as he pulled the hidden ball trick instead of handing the ball off to the running back to see how the defense reacted. The next set of drills were for kick off coverage and Raymer had each forward line block through a wall of defending blockers (left) to stop the kick off returner.
