Arlo Ray Hansen

Arlo Ray Hansen, 72, former businessman and Kiwanis Club member, died on Thursday, Aug. 26, 2010, at his home.

He was born on April 15, 1938, to Peter and Alice Hansen in Irvington, Neb. The family moved to Portsmouth, Iowa when he was almost two and he went to kindergarten at a country school and the rest of his school years were spent in Harlan, Iowa. After graduation he went into Army Reserve training at Fort Leonard Wood, Mo. and onto advanced infantry training at Fort Knox, Ky.

He went to work at a television and appliance store in Beatrice, Neb. and in 1972 he went to work for Nebraska Educational Television. In 1973 the family moved to Kirkham, Iowa and he attended a real estate sales school and got an Iowa Real Estate Sales Associate License.

In 1976 the family moved to Glenwood, Iowa where they lived for almost 20 years. He had a remodeling business and at age 38 he rejoined the Army Reserves and

became a Drill Sergeant and at 46 he retired from the Army Reserves.

In 1994 the couple were relieved managers for Motel 6 and became manages of Motel 6 in Goodland in 1995. He then began working for Walmart and then became a store manager for the Sinclair Station.

Mr. Hansen was an active member of the Kiwanis Club for 28 years and wanted to make Goodland a better community and helped in many different ways to make a difference for all. He was a member of the Goodland United Methodist Church.

The Kiwanis Club paid for Mr. Hansen to spend two nights at the Broadmoor at Colorado Springs and a trip to Pikes Peak and a fried chicken dinner which was his last wish.

Preceding him in death were his parents and a sister, Jeanette Dugger.

Survivors include his wife of the home; two daughters, Melissa Hansen of Denver and DeAnn (Rick) Elledge of Plattsmouth, Neb.; a brother, Florian (Nadine) Hansen of Kimballton, Iowa; a sister, Iona Stratbucker of Blair, Neb.; and three grandchildren.

A memorial service will be at 11 a.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 1, 2010, at the church.
