


"Having Riley in there how he runs over people and pounds it in there gives me an opportunity to come in and throw them off guard and be able to show my quickness," Bustillos said.

"I saw some awesome stuff tonight," he said. "I noticed some young guys who can play. Got to see what we need to improve on. A lot of things we will work on this week at practice"


