Before you head out, by visiting KanDrive, www.kandrive.org, a one-stop gateway for travel information in Kansas and surrounding states, you can get information to plan your trip.

In addition to the statewide map, snapshot camera and electronic at stadiums safely and on time for roadside sign views along I-70 and other highways in the state, the site provides road work and weather information and links to travel resources

Road information can also be obtained by calling 511 in Kansas or (866) 511-5368 from anywhere in the U.S. to find out about the latest driving conditions, work zone and travel weather information for the Turnpike and any Interstate, U.S.

or state highway in Kansas and Nebraska.

Phone numbers for road conditions in other states surrounding Kansas are also provided. Information is free from a landline phone; however, for cellular phone users, cell minutes may apply.

Travelers can also us handheld mobile devices, such as Smart phones or Blackberries to access text reports for construction information by visiting 511mm.ksdot. org.
