

Race winners determine speedway champions

Sherman County Speedway races Saturday were the last chance for drivers to gain points in the track championship race in each class for this season.

Track champions will be announced at the Flatlander Fall Classic that starts at 5 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 24. Races will continue at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 25. (In case of bad weather the races would be held on Sunday, Sept. 26).

In the IMCA Modified division Adam Morris (Car 8) was the winner of the feature race, and the unofficial track points standings put him in eighth for the season.

Jason Brees (21B) finished second in the feature race and about 13th in the points.

Darren DeLoach (21) was third in the feature and finished fifth in the track points.

Keith Stegman (19) was fourth in the feature and third in the standings.

Dewayne Dechant (2D) was fifth in the feature and about 15th in the point standings.

Nate Moore (7L) finished sixth in the feature, and unofficially he would edge out Chris Remetes (10) for the modified track champion by two points. Remetes finished ninth in the feature on Saturday. The point standings after the Bill Gray Memorial had Remetes leading the point standings with 208 and Moore right behind at 207. Saturday Moore earned 35 points to put him ahead of Remetes who earned 32 points.

In the IMCA Stock division Jeff Tubbs (37X) was the feature race winner and unofficially finished about ninth in the points standings.

Second place in the feature went to Ryan Wark (8) who finished eighth in the points standings.

Third in the feature was Jason Rogers (37) who finished second in the point standings.

Fourth in the feature went to Nick Tubbs (737) who finished first in the point standings leading over Rogers

in the feature race and about 11th in the points standings.

In the IMCA Sport Modifieds division there were enough cars to make a race and Matthew Crowell (2C) won the feature and first place in the track point standings.

Cowboys face Tigers tonight

The Goodland Cowboys will try to get a second win when they open at 6:30 p.m. at Cowboys Stadium tonight against the Ulysses Tigers.

The Cowboys opened their season at Hugoton on Friday and scored 24 points in the first quarter, 15 in the second, and finished the game off with 7 points in the third bringing the final score to 46-8.

Hugoton had very few returning starters looked nervous and not quite at the talent level of the Cowboys. After the game a smile plastered Cowboys Coach Kent Teeters face, and he said he was pleased with how his team played. Teeter was excited about the weapons the offense has developed since he came to Goodland.

Excitement was trailed with a col-

lective sigh of relief came from the Cowboys players and fans.

"It finally feels like these last three years we've worked hard and now it's being put to good use," said senior Robert Cowan, who led the team in tackles with 10.

Monday the focus switched to Ulysses. A traditionally successful and physical team, the Tigers will look to bounce back from an embarrassing loss at the hands of Liberal, 40-8.

The Tigers have five running backs who will get carries with the misdirection running game, with the quarterback faking one way and handing it to the opposite side.

Coach Teeter preached to his defense to read the keys and keep their eyes out of the backfield.

On offense, if the Cowboys can spread the ball around with the per-

fection they had last week it will be a long night for Ulysses.

Junior quarterback Reed Bellamy completed 22 of 27 passing attempts, going for 254 yards and three touchdowns. Leading rusher was senior back Chris Bustillos, who had 6 carries for 51 yards. Catching 7 balls for 83 yards senior wide out Dillon Trachsel lead the team in receptions with 9 different players catching the ball.

Ulysses will look to stop the big play, which should open up the short plays, as well as running plays.

Goodland players are excited to see how the turnout is tonight at Cowboys Stadium, as they roll out their new jerseys. Cowboys are confident and ready for the Ulysses Tigers who roll into town tonight.

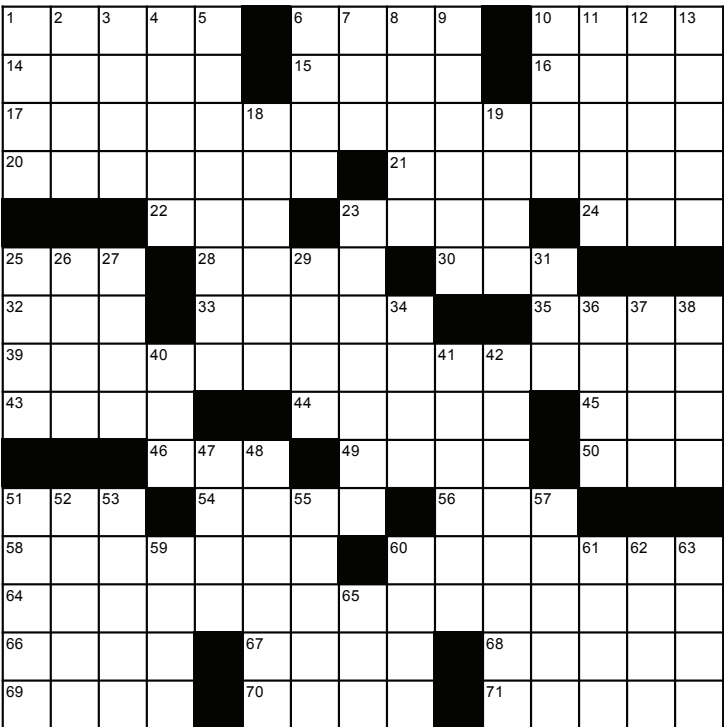
Here's How It Works:
