

Lady Mustangs play 40 volleyball matches at home round robin

The seventh and eighth grade volleyball teams of Grant Junior High played in their home round robin on Saturday at the Max Jones Fieldhouse.

"We played 40 matches, and a lot of athletes got a lot of playing time," said Activities Director Mary Kratky of Grant Junior High.

In the eighth grade "A" matches Goodland beat Wray 15-13, 9-15 and 16-14; Goodland lost to Burlington 15-9 and 15-11; Goodland lost to Norton 15-13 and 15-13 and 15-11; Holcomb beat Burlington 13-15, 15-12 and 15-1; Holcomb beat Norton 15-13 and 15-12; Holcomb beat Wray 15-10 and 19-17; Colby beat Burlington 15-11 and 15-10; Colby beat Wray 15-8, 15-17 and 15-8; and Norton beat Wray 15-10 and 19-17.

Goodland native Dani Bedore and her teammates are in Spokane, Wash., this weekend to compete in the Zags Volleyball Classic at Gonzaga University.

This will be the fourth and last tournament of the regular season for the University of Wyoming. The Cowgirls are 11-1 overall after winning three of four matches at a home tournament last weekend in Laramie.

Wyoming won both its matches Friday defeating Oregon's University of Portland 3-1 and the University of Texas at Arlington 3-0. On Saturday the Cowgirls earned their 11th straight victory with a 3-0 win over the University of Northern Colorado before suffering their first loss of the season to Boise State University 3-0.

Bedore recorded 37 kills during the tournament including a team-

high 12 in the Cowgirls' win over Northern Colorado. She has 93 kills for the season along with 42 digs and four service aces.

Wyoming faces Gonzaga tonight and tomorrow will take on the University of Idaho followed by a match against Seattle University.

The Cowgirls' first match within the Mountain West Conference will be Thursday at the University of Utah.
