Cowboys lose at home to Scott City, 36-14

The Cowboys fell at home Friday night to the undefeated Scott City Beavers, 36-14.

The Cowboys had some highlights in the contest including an 87-yard kick off return by Kelly Pearson in the first quarter to make it 7-6, and a second touchdown at the end of the game to make it 36-14.

The game started slow for the Cowboys with quarterback Reed Bellamy throwing an interception to Scott City's Ron Baker.

Baker scored on a 4-yard run to make it 7-0 early in the first quarter.

Special teams would come up big again for the Cowboys. On the ensuing kickoff Kelly Pearson returned it 87 yards for the score, which was a huge boot to for the Cowboys and cut the lead to 7-6. The point after try by Dallas DeLaRosa was no good.

Scott City wouldn't be outdone as they responded with an 11-yard touchdown run by Dalton Buehler. In the second quarter Baker showed up again with an 18-yard touchdown run, followed not long after by a Jason Williams 4-yard rushing score to make it 27-6 at half time.

Coming out of half the Cowboys slowed Scott City's offense but couldn't stop them completely as Buehler would run for another touchdown from 4 yards out to make it 33-6. The Cowboys Robert Cowan blocked the extra point.

In the fourth quarter Scott City's Michael McEchern kicked a 32-yard field goal to wrap up the Beaver scoring.

With 17 seconds left in the game Pearson added another touchdown to his total with a 1-yard run making it 36-12. The Cowboys converted the 2-point conversion pass to Nathan Deeds to make the final 36-14. The final Cowboy drive covered 49 yards in 8 plays with two minutes left in the game.

Bellamy threw to Helton who took the ball to the Beavers 26, and Ohara carried for a first down at the 15. Bellamy ran to the 11, and then to the 8 on second down. Deeds ran for a first and goal inside the 5.

On first down Pearson was stopped short of the goal line, but with the clock under 20 seconds Pearson would not be denied and scored on a one-yard run.

Earlier in the fourth quarter the Cowboys had a long drive starting at the Cowboys 20 and 19 plays and a penalty the drive stalled at the Beavers 12 when Bellamy's run on fourth down was less than a yard short of a first down.

Beaver quarterback Baker completed 11 of 21 passes for 22 yards and was picked off by Garth Helton.

Scott City's Jason Williams ran the ball 12 times for 74 yards and a score. Baker ran the ball 10 times for 18 yards and 2 touchdowns.

The Beavers spread the ball out in their play action passing game Friday, throwing to 5 different re-

ceivers. Jacob Rios led the team in tackles with 8 total.

For the Cowboys Bellamy completed 12 of 20 passes for 123 yards and 1 interception.

Pearson rushed the ball 10 times for 24 yards and a touchdown in addition to his kickoff return for 87 yards. Also rushing for the Cowboys, Riley Oharah took the ball 7 times for 29 yards.

Pearson had 3 receptions for 44 yards. Brock Wilkens and Garth Helton also caught 3 balls.

Scott City remains unbeaten as the Cowboys fall to 2-2. Goodland takes to the road Friday for a 6:30 p.m. kick off facing the 1-3 Lakin Broncos.

Goodland returns to Cowboy Stadium at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 8, for Homecoming to take on the rival Colby Eagles.
