City cleanup crews to start on Monday

City crews will spread out and begin the citywide cleanup on Monday with plans to cover all the town by Friday.

City Manager Doug Gerber said Tuesday the city crews have finalized plans for the cleanup, and will be dividing the city into quarters with a crew assigned to each quarter.

He said the city has been han-

dling some early calls, especially for tires.

He said the city crews will be going door to door and picking up items that are set out on the curb or in the alley.

"We have been doing some cleanup in the alleys," Gerber said, "but there we are concentrating on the trees."

A letter sent to all homeowners is asking that items to be hauled off to the transfer station be separated in to at least three piles. One would be all

steel or metal items. A second pile would be construction and debris items such as concrete or painted wood with or without nails. A third pile would be furniture items.

Tires would be a separate item, and Gerber said it is not necessary to call the city office for any special pickup. However, he said it would be helpful if people have large items like refrigerators, freezers or air conditioners that have refrigerant that has to be removed. If a person has one of these they can call 890-

4500 and talk to Fire Chief/Building Inspector Brian James or Gerber during business hours.

"We as a staff are excited about this," Gerber said. "We know it is not a cure all, but think it will help. This is truly a major issue, and as a city we need to keep working to clean things up."

The commissioners each have said they were in support of the cleanup program.

City Mayor Josh Dechant said he was glad the city staff was taking

this on as a project.

Commissioner Rick Billinger said it was a great idea and he said he knows there is some risk in picking up things, but said it is better to push forward and clean up the town as much as possible.

"This is a whole staff effort," he said. "We feel it is like trying to deal with the elephant in the room, and this is like taking a small bite out of the elephant."

The city will not pickup household hazardous waste items.
