## Goodland runners win Flatlander 5K

The annual Flatlander 5K Run and Family Fun Run/Walk were held early Saturday morning with 16 participants.

The event was split into three divisions, but all the runners went in one heat.

Seven runners participated in the Men's Competitive division with Matthew Johnson of Goodland, winning in a time of 19.03. Grady Bonsall of Goodland, was second at 22.05. Third was Kelly Sommerfeld of Colby at 22.5.

Others runners in the men's division included Terry Connorton of More, S.C. at 26.59; Steven Vallejo of Goodland, 29.48; Charlie Stallard of Colorado Springs, 23.45; and Dan McCurry of Goodland, 53.04.

Four women ran in the competitive division with Larissa Coon of Goodland winning at 27.17. Second was Angela Ferguson of Goodland, 28.09. Third was Lori Connorton of More, S.C., 28.17. Fourth was Denise Floyd of Goodland, 35.57.

The Family Fun run did not have a competition, but most enjoyed a brisk walk around the course.

All four of those in Family

Fun run were from Goodland including Joy Hayden (50.34); Kyla Sheldon (43.24); Jandi Smith (50.21); and Jessica White (26.26).

Sarah King, Goodland Activities Center administrator, said it was a good morning for the run, and was pleased with the way it went.

One little girl, Maddison Albers, showed up to do the "Elementary Mile" and was given a water bottle as her prize for completing the mile walk.

Members of the Goodland High School Cross Country Team helped man water stations, and seven ham radio operators from the Sherman County Amateur Radio Enthusiasts Club helped keep track of the runners progress around the course.

The course was changed this year to avoid having the runners on Main Ave. while the booths were being set up, and started and ended at the GAC. The course went east on Eighth Street to Eustis, turned north to Second Street, west to Kansas Ave., turned south to Ninth, east to Main and north to the GAC for the finish line.
