Cowboys face rival Eagles tonight for homecoming

The Goodland Cowboys are home tonight with kick off at 6:30 p.m., as Goodland tries to get the first home win in almost two overtime win over Lakin that improved years, against the rival Colby Eagles for Homecoming.

The Cowboys haven't won a home football game since Oct. 24, 2008 when they beat Ness City 43-8. The Cowboys have been road warriors this season, winning all 3 away games.
