Cowboys beat Eagles in rain delayed homecoming

When the Cowboys homecoming game did kickoff, the Cowboys were ready and beat the rival Colby Eagles 38-22.

"This was one felt great." Coach Kent Teeter said after the long night.

The stands on both sides of the field were filled with fans about 22 minutes before the planned kick off, but the announcers said the game was being delayed by a storm with lightning that was moving into the area. The field was cleared and everyone waited as the storm hit dropping about .25 inches of rain along with some close cloud to ground lightning strikes that made everyone happy they had taken cover in the high school cafeteria, under the stadium stands and at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The storm took a long time to move out of the area, and based on the Kansas High School Activity Association policy the officials had to wait about 30 minutes after the last lightning was seen. The game was scheduled to begin at 6:30 p.m., but finally got started about 9 p.m.

In the first quarter, Colby's Ryan Parker took the ball from 3 yards out on a 12-play 79 yard drive for the nights first score giving the Eagles a 6-0 lead.

The intensity Goodland had before the delay was hard to recapture, but they did starting in the second quarter. Cowboy Kelly Pearson would finish off a 17-play 77 yard drive with a 1 yard touchdown run. Austin Avelar made the extra point to give the Cowboys a 7-6 lead.

The Cowboys would score again when quarterback Reed Bellamy threw a 9 yard touchdown to Brock Wilkens on a 7-play 82 yard drive. The extra point was missed making it 13-6.
