Being green means doing small things everyday to make a difference in the world. Each day Americans produce 4.6 pounds of solid waste per person. Yet only 33 percent of solid waste was recycled.

How can you be part of the solution? The symbol for recycle is three arrows moving in a triangle. To do our part recycle.

Start by reducing the ecological footprint by consuming less energy and water and reducing solid waste. Be creative and find uses for a prod-

uct to keep it out of the landfill and finally recycle.

Consumers have a role by recycling and purchasing items made from recycled materials.

The time a glass bottle takes to decompose is 1 million years, monofilament fishing line 600 years, plastic beverage bottles 450 years, disposable diapers 450 years, aluminum cans 80 to 200 years, foam plastic cups 50 years, rubber boot soles 50 to 80 years, tin cans 50 years, leather 50 years, nylon fabric 30 to 40 years, plastic bag 10 to 20 years, cigarette butts 1 to 5 years, wool sock 1 to 5 years, plywood 1 to 3 years, waxed milk carton 3 months, apple core 2 months, newspapers 6 weeks, orange or banana peel 2 to 5 weeks, and paper towels 2 to 4 weeks.
