

Cowgirls win league volleyball title

The Goodland High School varsity volleyball team became the Great West Activity Conference League Champions at competition in Ulysses on Saturday.

There were three teams that went 4-1 and so they had to go to the first tie breakers, which was the percentage of games won.

Goodland was first with 4-1 and 81 percent of games won.

Coming in second with was Scott City with 4-1 and 72 percent of games won, Colby with 4-1 and 66 percent of games won, Holcomb 2-3 and Hugoton 1-4. Ulysses was third with 0-5.

The Cowgirls have a home triangular tonight starting at 4 p.m. with Norton and Ulysses. Sub state action will be Saturday at Lakin.

Coach Barb Bedore said they don't know yet who they will play as some teams will play tonight.

The season record for the Cowgirls was 23-11.

On Saturday Hugoton beat Ulysses, 23-25, 25-16 and 25-19; Scott City beat Holcomb 22-25, 25-22 and 25-13. In Goodland's first match they beat Hugoton 25-14 and 25-17. Colby beat Holcomb 22-25, 25-17 and 25-16.

Colby then beat Goodland 18-25, 25-10 and 25-21.

"In the match against Colby we had some metal errors," said Coach Bedore. "We had too many missed served in the second game."

Scott City beat Ulysses 25-17 and 25-13. Holcomb beat Ulysses 25-18 and Scott City beat Hugoton 25-17 and 25-12.

In their third match Goodland beat Holcomb 25-14 and 25-19. Colby beat Hugoton 25-15 and 25-11. Colby beat Ulysses 25-18 and 25-6.

Goodland then beat Scott City 25-18 and 25-13. Holcomb beat Hugoton 25-19 and 25-21. Scott City beat Colby 25-18 and 25-21.

In their last match Goodland beat Ulysses 25-6 and 25-15.

"We played well all day," said Coach Bedore. "We did a nice job of running the offense and at times our defense was good. We still need to improve our defensive play."
