

# Cowgirls win two; sub-state Saturday

The Cowgirls volleyball team swept the final triangular on Tuesday as they prepare for the sub-state Saturday at Lakin.

The Cowgirls defeated Ulysses 25-22 and 25-14, and Norton 25-19 and 25-14 at Max Jones Fieldhouse to finish the regular season at 25-11.

The Cowgirls won the Great West Activity Conference Championship Saturday, and will be the number 3 seed in the sub-state at Lakin.

Teams in the sub-state at Lakin include: Goodland, Hays-Thomas More Prep-Marian, Hoisington, Holcomb, Kismet-Southwestern Heights, Lakin, Larned and Scott City-Scott Community.

The Cowgirls will face Lakin (20-16) in the second match of the first round on Saturday with the matches starting at 1 p.m. Mountain Time. Other teams in the bracket with Goodland and Lakin are the number 2 seed Hoisington (29-5) and the number 7 seed Larned (7-29) who play in the match before the Cowgirls.

In the other half of the bracket the number 1 seed Kismet-Southwestern Heights (36-2) plays the number 8 seed Hays Thomas More Prep-Marian (4-26) in the first match. The second match will be the number 4 seed Scott City (24-13) against the number 5 seed Holcomb (21-14).

Coach Barb Bedore said she feels the girls are ready for sub-state and is looking forward to the matches.

The Cowgirls won the Great West Activity Conference Championship with a 4-1 record and 81 percent of

games won breaking a three-way tie with Scott City and Colby. Second was Scott City with 4-1 and 72 percent of games won, Colby was third with 4-1 and 66 percent of games won. Other teams in the league tournament were Holcomb 2-3, Hugoton 1-4, and Ulysses, 0-5.

# Cowboys 'must win' tonight against Phillipsburg Panthers

The Cowboys football team is at home tonight at 6 p.m. for the last time this season, and have their hands full against the 6-0 Phillipsburg Panthers in a key district game that could determine which team makes the playoffs.

Goodland has struggled at home this year only winning one game at Cowboy Stadium. Tonight at half time the seniors and parents will be honored.

Phillipsburg have been dominate this year beating Plainville 50-6, Smith Center 19-14, Oakley 21-7, Ellis 24-7, Washington County 28-6, and TMP 44-23. Their ground game has been dominate all year and the Panthers have a young star at the quarterback position.

Goodland, 4-3, has been up and

down all year and are walking the edge on making the playoffs. The Cowboys fell to Norton Friday, 40-9. In order to qualify for the playoffs Goodland will need to win tonight and next Thursday at Thomas More Prep in Hays.

Cowboys quarterback Reed Bellamy has gotten better as the season goes by completing 93 of 168 passes for 1,079 yards, 7 touchdowns and 6 interceptions.

Bellamy also has the most carries at 88 for 362 yards and 2 touchdowns.

Cowboy Kelly Pearson has 52 carries for 270 yards and 4 touchdowns. Riley Oharah has 48 touches for 162 yards and 2 touchdowns. Nathan Deeds has 31 carries for 210 yards and 4 touchdowns.

Cowboy Brock Wilkens has become Bellamy's favorite target. He

has 30 receptions for 356 yards and 3 touchdowns. Garth Helton has 13 catches for 155 yards and 1 touchdown. Pearson has 12 receptions for 239 yards and 2 touchdowns. Dillon Trachsel has 11 catches for 125 yards.

On the defensive side, the leader of the 4-3 defense Deeds has racked up 96 total tackles. Close behind him is Oharah with 75, Robert Cowan has 66, Devon Garrett has 55, and Dallas DeLaRosa has 50.

Goodland has one last shot to get it right and make it to the playoffs tonight when the Cowboys and Panthers kickoff at 6 p.m.. The Cowboys will have a short week to prepare for the final game of the regular season at 6 p.m. on Thursday at Thomas More Prep.

# Cowgirl golfer third at state

Goodland Cowgirls took seventh place at the 3-2-1A State Golf tournament held at Stone Ridge Country Club in Great Bend on Monday and had one girl win a state medal.

The tournament had 93 participants in 23 flights and Jazzmin Weis won a third place medal with her round of 97.

Holcomb won the state 3-2-1A State Championship with a team score of 421. Syracuse finished fourth with a score of 454. Goodland was seventh at 473. Larned was 12th at 533.

The Cowgirls were placed in flights based on regional scores. Weis was ranked 19th and in the fifth flight starting the tournament.

Coach Connie Livengood said the girls did a super job, and was proud of the whole team and pleased Jazz came out with a state medal.

Top individual golfer was Maggie Sloan, Pittsburg-St. Mary's Colgan with an 87. Second was Amy Stegman, Holcomb, 96. Third was Weis, 97. Fourth Katelyn Marlin, Sublette,

99. Fifth Jaly McCauley, St. Francis tied with two others at 100.

"I am proud of how these girls performed at the state tournament,"

she said. "We knew going in realistically we could finish anywhere from fourth to eighth place. We were tied for third going into the back nine, but we had some problems and the other teams did not."

"The scores were high, but considering it was state, the wind blew and it was cold to start out the

day. One hole alone had several 14's and 15's on it. It had two trees in the middle of the fairway and it was that hard. The north winds made the course play very hard. There were a lot of out of bounds."

I am proud of Jazzmin Weis, Livengood said, she played the course very well and placing third as a sophomore is certainly a great accomplishment. Hats off to her.

The rest of the group finished out well.

Cortney Cowan is improving her game. She shot a 124, and for that

course it was a good score.

Jacquelyn Gulley finished her career shooting a 125. She did a great job, not only this tourney but throughout the season.

Jordan Knitig and Katelyn Coon had 127's. It was good to see Katelyn bounce back and play better. Jordan shot one of her better 9 holes, a 57, but then came back with a 70. She will become more consistent.

Megan Siruta shot a 159. She had a rough day with the trees and out of bounds.

"All in all, I am pleased with how the girls finished out their 2010 season," Livengood said. "Most everyone learned something, made friends, and improved. Our goal was to get to state this year, since we were so young and had only one golfer back with varsity experience, which was Jazz, whom improved her placing in state this year. We did accomplish that and much more. It has been fun seeing the highlights of their golf game, whether it was birdies, pars, or low putts for the day of the team. I believe the team came together and they enjoyed their year."

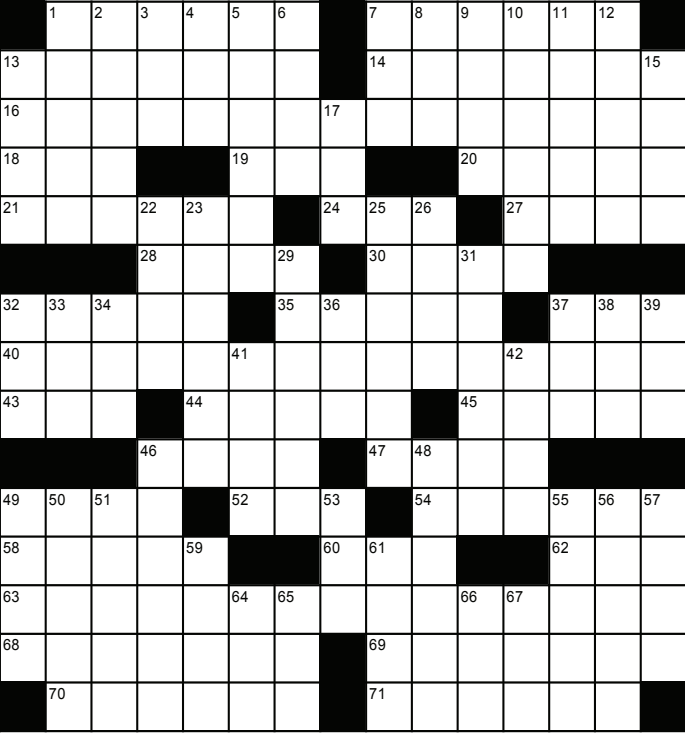
