NW Tech Maverick wrestling season opens today

The Northwest Tech Maverick wrestling season opens at 4 p.m. today at Max Jones Fieldhouse against Air Force Prep.

Maverick Coach Steve Lampe said he feels the team will give a good performance, and hopes wrestling fans come out to see the first ever match today.

The Mavericks will be in Colby on Saturday for the Colby Community College Open Tournament.

Tuesday afternoon about 50 people showed up for the Maverick open house held at the Derrick Lutters Armory, and the Goodland Ambassadors held a special ribbon cutting ceremony for the wrestling team.

Lampe explained differences between high school and college wrestling and thanked the donors who came up with about \$21,000 for the beautiful black wrestling mats the team will move from the armory to Max Jones for the match.

Lampe said one difference between high school and college is the matches last seven minutes with a three minute first period and two minutes for the second and third periods.

He said the college is starting a Maverick Booster Club to help support the program. He said it takes money to help a program be successful, and the college is selling special coats and shirts.

He said he hopes to see lots of Maverick fans at the Colby Community Building on Saturday to cheer the team on at the Colby Community College Open.

The Mavericks will be at Baker University in Baldwin City on Nov. 7, at the University of Wyoming in Larmie, on Nov. 13, at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley on Nov. 20, at Fort Hays State University on Dec. 4, at University of Nebraska at Kearney on Dec. 11, and at Western Wyoming Community College at Rock Springs on Dec. 14 before the Christmas break.

The Mavericks will be back at Max Jones Fieldhouse for the Maverick Open on Jan. 8.

The Mavericks will host a dual with Western Wyoming Community College on Jan. 12 at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The Mavericks will travel to Worthington, Minn., on Jan. 15 for a

dual at Minnesota West Community College.

They travel to Colorado Springs Jan. 26 for a return dual with Air Force Prep.

The team will be in Hays for the Kansas Cup on Jan. 30 where all Kansas college teams will compete.

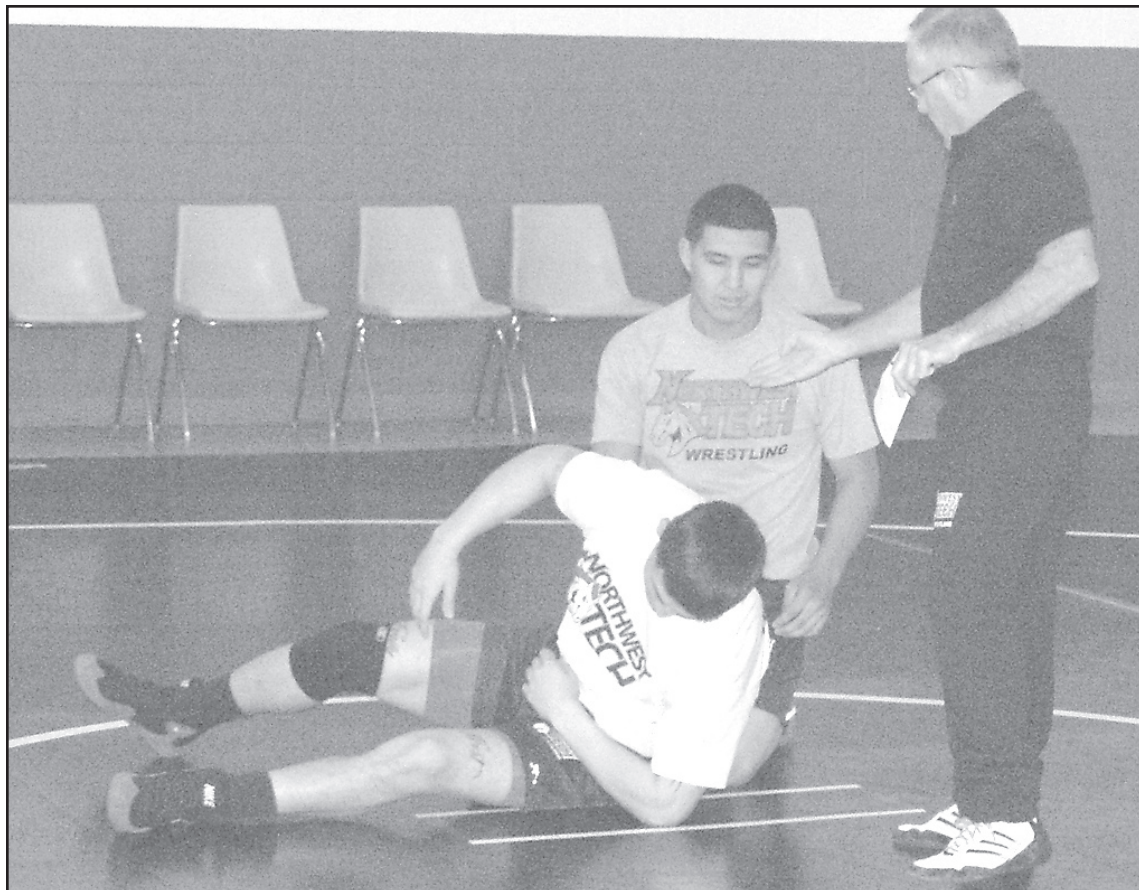
The team will be in Pubelo, Colo., on Feb. 3, for the University of Southern Colorado dual.

The National Qualifying West Central Regional tournament will be held on Feb. 12 at Powell, Wyo.

The final tournament will be Feb. 24-25 for the National Junior College Athletic Association Championships at Spokane, Wash.

Lampe introduced the team members and said in college there are 10 weight classes where there are 14 in high school.

Cowboys can make playoffs with win over Hays team

The 5-3 Goodland Cowboys finished out district play Thursday at Lewis Field in Hay against the 2-6 Thomas More Prep in Hays. Thomas More Prep Monarchs, and a win would assure the Cowboys a berth in the bi-district round of the state Class 3A playoffs.

With a win on Thursday the Cowboys would be in the first round of the playoffs, and probably find themselves on the road Tuesday to face the Scott City Beavers.

A mind warping list of scenarios could change the play off picture.

A good scenario would be if Phillipsburg defeat Norton and the Cowboys win it is possible in a tie-breaker the Cowboys could enter the play offs as the number one from the district. Among the other scenarios is one where the Cowboys lose to the Monarchs and Phillipsburg defeats Norton, and again with the tie breakers the Cowboys would make the play offs.

The best scenario is for the Cowboys to defeat Thomas More Prep to eliminate nearly all the play off scenarios.

The Monarchs (2-6) started the season by beating Ellinwood 27-6.

After a loss at home to Russell 18-6 the Monarchs had their last win at Larned 49-6.

Thomas More Prep has lost every game since; at home to LaCrosse 55-28, on the road against Hoisington 21-15, at Cimarron 40-14, back home to Phillipsburg 44-23, and finally on the road on Friday to Norton 63-14.

Goodland has secured the first winning season under Head Coach Kent Teeter this year. They started out beating Hugoton 46-8 on the road, losing the home opener 25-8 against Ulysses, on the road to defeat Holcomb 38-13, at home to

lose against Scott City 36-14, and on the road to beat Lakin in overtime 31-28. The Cowboys returned to Goodland for homecoming and after a long rain delay beat rival Colby 38-22. In district play the Cowboys lost to Norton 40-9 at home, and Friday defeated the previously undefeated Phillipsburg Panthers 48-28 at Cowboy Stadium.

The Cowboys offense has been rolling for a few weeks and hope to continue the success against the Monarchs.

Quarterback Reed Bellamy has completed 111 of 193 passes for 1,325 yards, 9 touchdowns, and 6

interceptions. He has 99 carries for 397 yards and 2 touchdowns.

Senior Kelly Pearson exploded against the Panthers and has 67 carries for 423 yards and 8 touchdowns. Riley Oharah has done a very good job blocking for teammates and has 61 carries for 207 yards and 2 touchdowns. Nathan Deeds has 31 carries for 210 yards and 4 touchdowns.

Senior Brock Wilkens is the leading receiver for Goodland with 34 catches for 411 yards and 4 touchdowns. Pearson has 18 receptions for 352 yards and 3 touchdowns. Dillon Trachsel has 14 catches for 159 yards. Garth Helton has 13 catches

for 155 yards and 1 touchdown.

On the defense, Deeds has had an amazing year with 108 total tackles and 2 interceptions. Oharah is close behind with 90 tackles and 2 sacks. Robert Cowan has 74 tackles and 1.5 sacks. Devon Garrett has 62 tackles and 1 sack. Seth Miller and Garth Helton both have 2 interceptions behind ball hawk Trachsel who has 3.

If the Cowboys beat the Monarchs they will be in the playoffs. The goal for this year's team is to win a playoff game. The Cowboys are on track and it begins with a win Thursday.

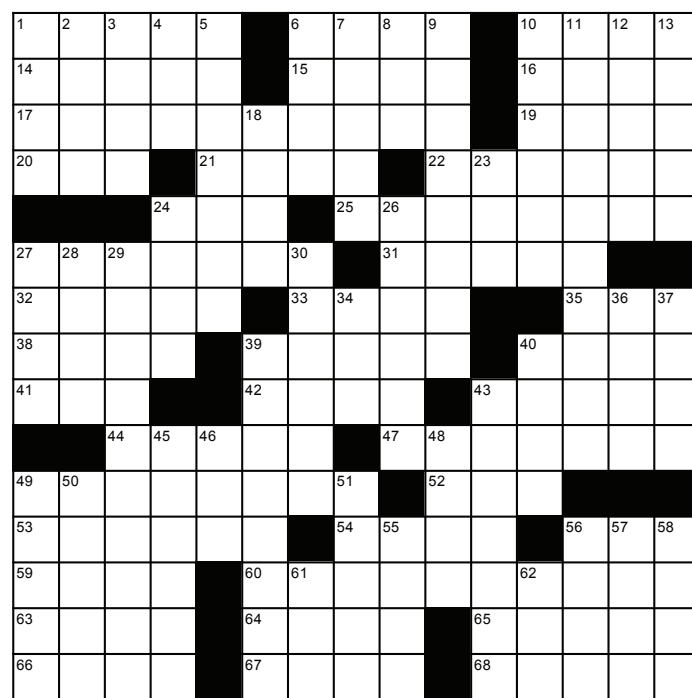

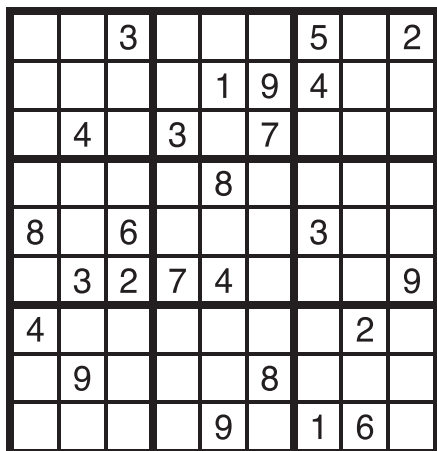
