

Cowboys sweep games at Colby

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The Cowboys improved their season record to 7-3 on Monday winning both games of a doubleheader against the Colby Eagles in Colby winning 9-4 and 12-8.

Coach Devlin Mull said it was a long afternoon and got pretty cold by the end of the second game.

Garth Helton was the starting pitcher for the first game and had nine strikeouts, four walks and gave up five hits.

The Cowboys took a 2-0 lead in the first with runs scored by Ryder Kling and Reed Bellamy. Cowboy Ryan Hillmer scored in the second on singles by Kling and Gunner Helton to make it 3-0.

The Eagles scored two runs in the second to make it 3-2. Goodland scored a run in the third to make it 4-2, and another in the fourth to make it 5-2.

In the fifth inning Goodland added three runs while Colby had two runs to make it 8-4. Goodland added a run in the seventh to win 9-4.

Cowboy Ryan Hillmer was the starting pitcher for the second game and pitched five innings giving up four runs on seven hits, five strikeouts and one walk. Cowboy Michael Pettibone came in for the sixth inning in relief giving up four runs on three hits, had one strikeout and two walks.

The Cowboys took a 2-0 lead in the first on runs by Gunner Helton and Bellamy. Added two runs in the second by Pettibone and Hillmer to lead 4-0.

Colby had 3 runs in the third to close to 4-3. Goodland came back in the fourth with five runs scored by Kling, Avelar, Pettibone, Hillmer and Devon Garrett to make it 9-4

The Cowboys added three runs in the fifth to make it 12-4. Colby had

one run in the sixth and rallied for three runs in the seventh to make the final score 12-8.

The Cowboys play at 3 p.m. on

Tuesday at Memorial Field against Plainville and are home on Thursday at 3 p.m. against Holcomb.

Golfers second at Hays, Cowboy top medalist

Monday the Goodland Cowboys Golf Team was up against some tough competition at Smoky Hill Country Club in Hays coming in second and a Cowboy won the individual championship.

Hays won the tournament with a team score of 316, 10 strokes ahead of Goodland at 326. Third went to Dodge City 328, fourth Hutchinson 331, fifth Salina South 343, sixth Topeka West 346 tied with Salina Central 346, eighth Garden City 347, ninth Thomas More Prep 347, 10th Great Bend 362, 11th Liberal 382 and 12th Junction City 419.

Cowboy George Bellani was the top medalist in the tournament shooting a 73, two over par for the Country Club 18-hole course. He was the Senior Class medalist.

"We shot a 326, which is very respectable for this course," said Coach Terry Daise. "Getting

second place against this type of competition was quite an accomplishment.

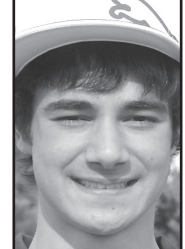
"George had a great day shooting a 73, which won him the overall individual champion."

On Friday the Cowboys golf team will be in action at 1 p.m. at Oakley. On Saturday, April 30, the team starts at 8 a.m. at Atwood.
