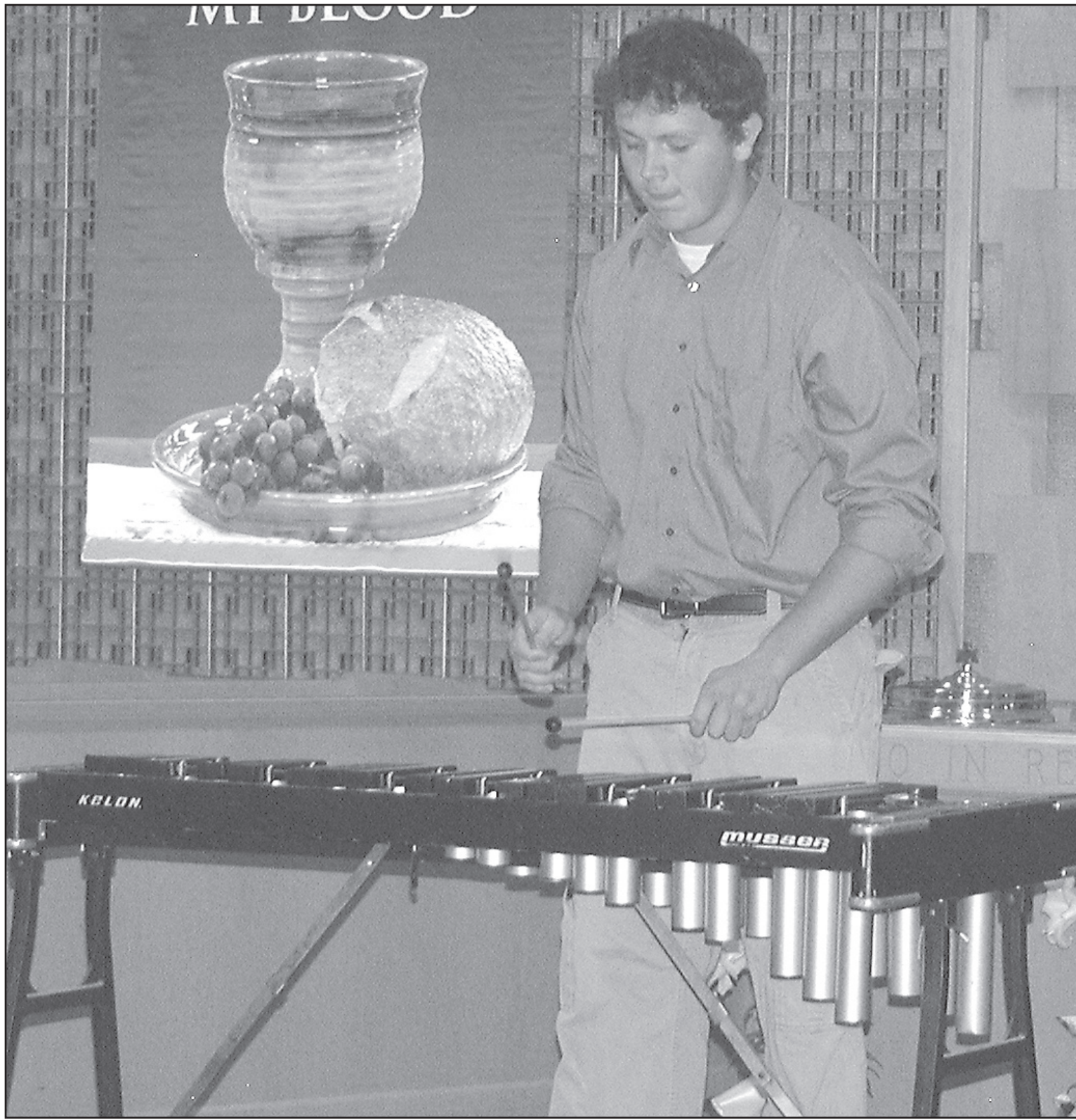

Annual Sampler Fest this weekend in Leavenworth

The 22nd annual Kansas Sampler Festival will be held in Leavenworth's Ray Miller Park, 4201 S. Fourth, on Saturday and Sunday. The festival is known as a living brochure of what there is to see, do, hear, taste, buy and learn in Kansas. Among the 150 communities attending are Goodland, Alma, Burlington, Concordia, El Dorado, Greensburg, Kansas City, Meade, Oakley, Paola, Topeka and Wa-Keeney. Goodland will be in the Northwest Kansas Regional Tent and

will the Giant Van Gogh Painting, Carnegie Arts Center, The Ennis-Handy House, High Plains Museum, Kidder Massacre and the many unique attractions that Sherman County has. Working in the Northwest Kansas regional tent for Sherman County Convention and Visitors Bureau will be Donna Price. The Northwest tent will be giving popcorn away to those in attendance. The popular "Wheel of Wonder" will also be present. The prizes this year are again unique and represent all of Northwest Kansas.

"On this weekend we celebrate all that is Kansas but the desired outcome of the festival is to inspire people to travel the state year-round," said WenDee LaPlant of the Kansas Sampler Foundation. The state's largest travel show will showcase such information as the Pancake Day Hall of Fame in Liberal, the home of the state's oldest continuous veterans' reunion in Erie, the Midland Railway in Baldwin City, Kansas Scenic Byways, the Kansas Underground Salt Museum, and the only hyperbolic paraboloid church in the state in

Ulysses. Flying W Ranch of Cedar Point will bring a bucket calf and Mahaffie Stagecoach Stop and Farm will give stagecoach rides. Kansas entertainers include The Gospel of Jazz Friendship, Ann Zimmerman, Dennis Lee Rogers, and Jeff Davidson and the Trail Riders, plus others. Historic performers portray such people as Amelia Earhart, Civil War photographer Alexander Gardner, Mary Jane Ritchie of the Underground Railroad, and buffalo hunter Billy Dixon. Marci Penner will ask Kansas questions from the Stump four times a day.

Kansas products include chocolate, jellies, salsa, sauces, honey, lavender products, goats milk soap, jewelry, sesquicentennial souvenirs and more. Kansas artists and authors will have their works on sale. More than 15 food vendors will feature bierocks, barbecue, buffalo burgers, German sausage, Scottish sausage, Marcon Pies, chicken tomatillo tamales, fruit tacos, turkey legs and more. The popular Kansas wine and beer tasting tent will return. Festival hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on

Sunday. The opening ceremony will take place at 8 a.m. on Saturday. Admission is \$5 for adults; \$3 for children 7-14. Find more information at www.kansassamplerfestival.com. The festival is a project of the Kansas Sampler Foundation and the event moves around the state every two years and will be held in Liberal in 2012 and 2013.
