

Goodland wins 11 races, 4 relays to take second

The Goodland Swim Club hosted the fifth swim meet Saturday of the season. It was the first one ever with eight swimming lanes. The Northwest Kansas Championship meet will be held in Colby's new pool on Friday and Saturday. That meet will also have eight swimming lanes.

After a one-hour lightning delay, the swimming finally got started. Goodland had six swimmers winning 11 individual races and four relay teams won. The team placed second with 232 points behind the Wray Swim Club with 249.

Dusty Johnson (11-12 boys) had an outstanding day winning all three of his races and setting two pool records. He won the 100-yard freestyle (1:08.10 new pool record), the 50-yard backstroke (36.37 new pool record) and 50-yard breaststroke (41.09).

Taryn Bedore (15-18 girls) also had a great day winning three gold medals. She won the 100-yard freestyle (1:03.49), 50-yard freestyle (27.14) and 100-yard butterfly (1:10.22).

Gerell Miller (13-14 boys) won the 50-yard freestyle (27.19) and 100-yard backstroke (1:18.11). He placed second in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:21.40).

Ian Bonsall (15-18 boys) won the 50-yard freestyle (24.40) and was second in the 100-yard freestyle (54.99).

Ethan McDaniel (8 and under boys) took home the gold in the 25-yard butterfly (23.84) and won two silver medals in the 50-yard freestyle (45.81) and 25-yard butterfly (18.03).

Rachel Witman (9-10 girls) won the 25-yard butterfly (18.03), was second in the 25-yard backstroke (20.34) and fourth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:31.72).

The 11-12 mixed 200-yard freestyle was first (2:47.58) with Rachel Witman, Austin Hahn, Hannah Eslinger and Ryan Volk swimming.

The 13-14 mixed 200-yard freestyle was first (2:10.89) with Ellee McDaniel, Simon Bassett, Aaron Avelar and Gerell Miller swimming.

The 8 and under mixed 100-yard medley was first (1:56.46) with Annika Linin, Jared Stoffel, Ethan McDaniel and Devontay Hardy swimming.

The 15-18 mixed 200-yard medley A team was first (2:11.90) with Bedore, Gerell Miller, Holton Witman and Aaron Avelar swimming.

In 8 and under girls Sydney Hahn was fifth in the 50-yard freestyle (52.53) and third in the 25-yard backstroke (26.44) and Athena Armstrong was fourth in the 25-yard freestyle (22.91).

The 8 and under girls 100-yard freestyle relay was fifth (2:24.61) with Armstrong, Annika Linin, Sydney Hahn and Vivian Soloman swimming.

In 8 and under boys Jared Stoffel was fourth in the 50-yard freestyle (49.94), fourth in the 25-yard backstroke (32.10) and second in the 25-yard breaststroke (27.08) and Hardy was fifth in the 25-yard freestyle (23.76).

The 8 and under boys 100-yard freestyle relay was second (1:46.94) with Jared Stoffel, Walker Eslinger, Hardy and Ethan McDaniel swimming.

The 9-10 girls 100-yard medley was fifth (2:07.73) with Rebecca Lockhart, Teryn Teeter, Peri Sieck and Savannah Soloman swimming.

In 9-10 boys Austin Hahn was third in the 100-yard freestyle (1:24.05), fifth in the 25-yard freestyle (17.28) and third in the 25-yard breaststroke (23.87) and Ryan Volk was fifth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:26.83) and second in the 100-yard individual medley (1:51.84).

In 11-12 girls Sianna Miller was sixth in the 100-yard freestyle

In 13-14 girls Makayla Kennedy was fifth in the 400-yard freestyle (7:13.55), sixth in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:39.46) and sixth in the 200-yard individual medley (3:46.29) and Paetyn Barriclow was fifth in the 100-yard backstroke (1:43.76).

The 13-14 girls 200-yard freestyle was second (2:33.62) with Savannah Bassett, Paetyn Barriclow, Makayla Kennedy and Lindsey Geeska swimming.

The 13-14 girls 200-yard medley was third (3:09.16) with Barriclow, Kennedy, Savannah Bassett and Danielle McElhaney swimming.

Camp will be from 9:30 to 11 a.m., Monday through Thursday. Cleats, shorts and T-shirt. There is a fee for the camp.

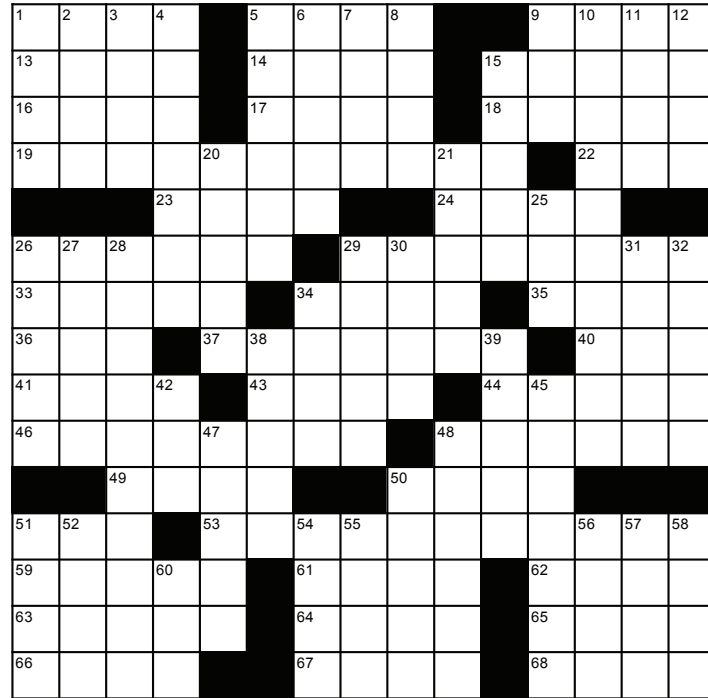

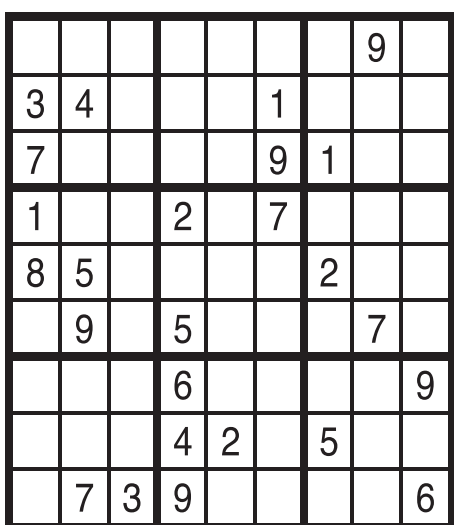
