Motor vehicles leading cause of death

National Child Passenger Safety Week began Sunday and goes through National Seat Check Saturday. Because motor vehicles are the leading cause of death for children ages three to 14, Child Passenger Safety Week marks a national effort to remind parents and caregivers of the lifesaving effect child safety seats have in protecting young children.

"Child passenger Safety Week is inherent to protecting lives on Kansas roads. Our youngest passengers can't make the decision to use a car seat, so as adults, we must help keep them safe," Colonel Ernest E. Garcia, superintendent of the Kansas Highway Patrol, said.

The Kansas Traffic Safety Resource Office provides a helpful tool in determining the best seat and

fit for your child at www.ktsro.org/files/Law-Card.pdf.

Adults should always read the child restraint manufacturer's instructions and the instructions found in their vehicle owner's manual before installing a safety seat. Studies show that the three most common mistakes in installing a child safety seat are:

- Not attaching the seat correctly and tightly to the car or truck.
- Not fastening the harness tightly enough.
- Not using the chest clip, or using it incorrectly.
