

Cowgirls golf teams place third at Russell, Colby

The Cowgirls split their team on Monday with a team traveling to Russell and the other traveling to Colby with both teams taking third place.

Coach Connie Livengood said she was pleased with how the girls played in both tournaments.

"We had a great day for golf," she said, "and all the teams did well."

Talking about the team that went to Russell Livengood said she was happy with their performance and the third place finish.

At Colby the Cowgirls finished third with Ulysses winning the tournament with a team score of 197. Colby was second with a team score of 223 and Goodland was third with 234.


Here's How It Works:
