He was a member of both the Colorado and Kit Carson Cattlemen's

Association and the Goodland Elks Lodge. Mr. Davis was known for his big brimmed western hat, his bolts, a penchant for quality cowboy boots and a good steak or prime rib.

Mr. Davis held season tickets for many years for the University of Colorado Buffalo football games and was a proud Burlington Cougar Car holder.

Preceding him in death were his parents; a daughter, Judy Davis Wagoner; his brother Billy and wife Evelyn D. Davis; another brother, Jack Davis; and his aunt, Minta (Claude) Shaw Coleman.
