The Goodland Cowgirls played their second game of the Hillsboro Trojan Classic Tournament at 2 p.m. on Friday against the Thomas More Prep-Marian Lady Monarchs of Hays. The Cowgirls managed to play a better game than the first round, but still fell to the Lady Monarchs, 64-43.

At the start of the first quarter the Lady Monarchs hit a three-point basket on their first possession. The Cowgirls played pretty evenly with Winfield, but after the Lady Vikings got six points ahead in the third quarter the Cowgirls were never able to catch up.

The starters for the Cowgirls were sophomores Berkley White, Brianna White, Cochran, Siruta and senior Hinger.

After the tipoff, the Lady Vikings took possession of the ball. They tried to hit the basket and rebounded the ball five times and were unable




