

Goodland swim team wins first meet of season

The Goodland Swim Team was in Holyoke, Colo., on Saturday and won the first Northwest Kansas Swim League meet with 308 points. Swimmers set four individual and one relay pool records. The team also won 18 individual and seven relay races.

The team will travel to Wray, Colo., Saturday for their second meet.

Ethan McDaniel (8 and under boys) set records in the 50-yard freestyle (39.78) and 25-yard freestyle (17.88). He also won the 25-yard butterfly (21.36).

Dusty Johnson (13-14 boys) beat the record in the 100-yard backstroke (1:15.87).

Ian Bonsall (15-18 boys) set the record in the 50-yard freestyle (24.04). He was also a member of the record setting 15-18 mixed A team 200 yard freestyle relay (1:46.04) new pool record with Taryn Bedore, Zach Miller and Holton Witman swimming.

Taryn Bedore (15-18 girls) was a three-time winner, winning the 100-yard freestyle (1:03.42), 100-yard backstroke (1:14.06) and 100-yard butterfly (1:13.05).

Lindsey Cure (8 and under girls) was winner in the 25-yard freestyle (20.19) and 25-yard backstroke (22.40).

Devinee Borgman (11-12 girls) won gold in the 50-yard freestyle (30.95) and 50-yard butterfly (34.87).

Levi House won two races: the 50-yard freestyle (33.09) and the 100-yard individual medley (1:32.70).

Winning one race each was Gantzen Miller (8 and under boys) 25-yard backstroke (23.14), Rachel Witman (9 and under girls) 25-yard butterfly (18.03), Chalee Luther (11-12 girls) 100-yard freestyle (1:14.59) and Peyton Sieck (11-12 boys) 100-yard freestyle (1:18.77).

Relay winners were 9-10 girls 100-yard freestyle (1:14.75) and medley (1:33.47) relays with Rachel Witman, Rebecca Lockhart, Peri Sieck and Lauren Cure swimming; the 11-12 girls 100-yard freestyle (2:22.46) with Borgmann, Chalee Luther, Ellie McDaniel and Kaitlyn

Townsend swimming; the 15-18 mixed 200-yard medley (2:12.93) with Aaron Avelar, Holton Witman, Bedore and Bonsall swimming; and the 8 and under boys 100-yard medley (2:00.08) with Linkon Cure, Gantzen Miller, Ethan McDaniel and Devontey Hardy swimming.

In 8 and under girls Linsey Cure was third in the 50-yard freestyle (46.49), first in the 25-yard freestyle (20.19) and first in the 25-yard backstroke (22.40); Sydney Hahn was fifth 50-yard freestyle (48.13), second 25-yard freestyle (20.24) and third in the 25-yard backstroke (24.34); and Mya Nemechek was sixth in the 50-yard freestyle (49.58) and fifth in the 25-yard freestyle (22.10).

The 8 and under girls 100-yard freestyle relay was second (1:40.24) with Sydney Hahn, Nemechek, Lindsey Cure and Olivia Bassett swimming.

In 8 and under boys Hardy was fifth in the 50-yard freestyle (1:00.89) and fourth in the 25-yard freestyle (23.22); Gantzen Miller was first in the 25-yard backstroke (23.14) and fourth in the 25-yard breaststroke (35.04); and Linkon Cure was fourth in the 25-yard backstroke (30.27).

The 8 and under boys 100-yard freestyle relay was second (1:48.12) with Ethan McDaniel, Dexter Dautel, Linkon Cure and Hardy swimming.

In 9-10 girls Rachel Witman was fourth in the 25-yard freestyle (16.17), second in the 2-yard backstroke (20.02) and first in the 25-yard butterfly (18.03); Peri Sieck was second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:32.29), sixth in the 25-yard butterfly (23.53) and sixth in the 100-yard individual medley (1:52.48); and Lauren Cure was sixth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:52.48).

In 9-10 boys Leyton Cure was third in the 100-yard freestyle (1:36.38, fourth in the 25-yard freestyle (16.62) and third in the 25-yard butterfly.

The 9-10 mixed 100-yard freestyle was fifth (1:44.81) with Truman Hooker, Vivian Soloman, Leyton Cure and Gantzen Miller swimming.

In 11-12 girls Borgmann was first

in the 50-yard freestyle (30.95), first in the 50-yard butterfly (34.87) and second in the 100-yard individual medley (1:22.22); Chalee Luther was first in the 100-yard freestyle (1:14.59), second in the 50-yard backstroke (39.98) and second in the 50-yard breaststroke (45.55); and Ellie McDaniel was second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:18.29) and second in the 50-yard freestyle (33.49).

The 11-12 girls 200-yard medley was second (3:08.64) with Townsend, Chalee Luther, Borgman and Ellie McDaniel swimming.

In 11-12 boys House was first in the 50-yard freestyle (33.09), second in the 50-yard butterfly (42.93) and first in the 100-yard individual medley (1:32.70); Powell Sieck was fourth in the 50-yard backstroke (34.37), second in the 50-yard backstroke (44.70) and third in the 50-yard butterfly (43.26); Ryan Volk was fourth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:25.47) and fifth in the 100-yard individual medley (2:02.79); Peyton Sieck was first in the 100-yard freestyle (1:18.77), second in the 50-yard freestyle (33.60) and second in the 100-yard individual medley (1:37.24); and Austin Hahn was third in the 50-yard breaststroke (51.94).

The 11-12 boys 200-yard freestyle relay was first (2:24.35) with House, Chase Johnson, Peyton Sieck and Ryan Volk swimming.

The 1-12 boys 200-yard medley was second (2:50.74) with Powell Sieck, Ryan Volk, House and Austin Hahn swimming.

The 13-14 girls 200-yard freestyle relay was sixth (2:52.70) with Kinsey Volk, Sianna Miller, Kyndell King and Savannah Soloman swimming.

The 13-14 girls 200-yard medley was sixth (3:42.99) with Kyndell King, Sianna Miller, Kinsey Volk and Savannah Soloman swimming.

In 13-14 boys Dusty Johnson was second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:08.33), first in the 100-yard backstroke (1:15.87) new pool record and fourth in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:31.01); Hagan Hoss was second in the 50-yard freestyle (28.97), second in the 100-yard

butterfly (1:24.18) and second in the 200-yard individual medley (3:12.19); Simon Bassett was fifth in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:33.36).

The 13-14 boys 200-yard freestyle was second (2:04.52) with Dusty Johnson, Powell Sieck, Simon Bassett and Hoss swimming.

The 13-14 boys 200-yard medley was second (2:29.99) with Dusty Johnson, Simon Bassett, Hoss and Peyton Sieck swimming.

In 15-18 girls Brooke Lockhart was sixth in the 100-yard freestyle (1:14.12) and sixth in the 100-yard backstroke (1:31.81); Savannah Bassett was third in the 100-yard butterfly (1:46.05); and Makayla

Kennedy was fourth in the 100-yard individual medley (3:53.87).

In 15-18 boys Bonsall was second in the 100-yard freestyle (54.90), first in the 50-yard freestyle (24.04) new pool record and second in the 100-yard backstroke (1:13.87); Holton Witman was fourth in the 50-yard freestyle (27.01), third in the 100-yard butterfly (1:15.87) and third in the 100-yard individual medley (3:07.33); Zach Miller was third in the 50-yard freestyle (26.87) and second in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:19.42); and Avelar was fifth in the 100-yard backstroke (1:33.72).

The 15-18 mixed 200-yard freestyle B team was sixth with Brooke

Lockhart, Avelar, Rachel Horney and Savannah Bassett swimming.

The 15-18 mixed 200-yard medley B team was sixth (2:58.56) with Brooke Lockhart, Kennedy, Savannah Bassett and Kate-Lynn King swimming.

Camp King also competed.

Holyoke Swim Club was second with 230 points, Wray Swim Club third with 206, Colby Swim Club fourth with 152.5, Burlington Swim Team fifth with 150, Oberlin Swim Club sixth with 133, Flagler Swim Club seventh with 27 and the Oakley Swim Club eighth with 23 points.
