Donald Duane Loutzenhiser

Donald Duane Loutzenhiser, 78, Flagler, Colo., construction business owner, died Friday, June 8, 2012, at his home.

He was born May 30, 1934, to Donald and Levita (Gattshall) in Flagler, Colo., one of four children.

In 1941 he started school at Shiloh School north of Flagler and graduated in 1953 from Flagler High School. In the fall he went to Colorado A&M, which is now Colorado State University. January 1954 he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps. The next four years, three months and 28 days he worked in MCRD Recruit Depot in Japan, Korea, Camp Pendleton and Camp Elliott. Mr. Loutzenhiser was discharged as a Sgt. E4 in 1958. For the next ten years he farmed.

In 1964, he teamed up with Bob Hall and his harvest crew. On May 18, 1972, he and Hazel Jackson were married and in 1979 he adopted a son, Doyle Loutzenhiser. They also had a daughter, Penny Kay, and a son Donald Glenn Loutzenhiser. The couple divorced in November 1982.

In May 1985 he and Ruth Kraxberger were married. She had one son Bob Kraxberger whom Mr. Loutzenhiser considered his own son. After the couple were married they moved back to the original family homestead east of Flagler. Over the years they built their home and several other out buildings to help with his construction business.

He was a member of the Flagler American Legion Post 81 for 34

years, as commander and District 2 representative. Mr. Loutzenhiser was involved with the Flagler Boy Scout Troop 56.

In 2002, he was diagnosed with Renal Cell Carcinoma, which reoccurred in 2008 as a brain tumor. In 2010 his cancer grew in numerous other areas of his body. In December of 2011, he decided to discontinue cancer treatment and came home to live and enjoy the remainder of his life.

Preceding him in death were his parents and an infant son, Donald Glenn Loutzenhiser.

Survivors include his wife of Hugo, Colo.; two sons, Doyle (Pam) Loutzenhiser of Stratton, Colo. and Bob (Tracy) Kraxberger of Hugo, Colo.; a daughter, Penny Loutzenhiser of Thornton, Colo.; a brother, Gregg (Renee) Loutzenhiser of Flagler, Colo.; two sisters, Joe (Bob) Mix of Colorado Springs, Colo. and Darlene (Jerry) Jewel of Texas; five grandchildren; and seven great-grandchildren.

Services were at 10 a.m. Monday, June 11, 2012, at the Flagler Baptist Church with Pastor Mark DeWett officiating and burial in the Flagler Cemetery with Military Honors by the Flagler American Legion Post.

Lewis Carlin

Lewis Carlin, 74, Burlington, former Burlington Manor manager, died Friday, June 8, 2012, at Colorado Springs, Colo.

He was born on Jan. 20, 1938, to Thomas Lee Carlin and Dortha (Latshaw) Carlin in Neosho, Mo. He spent his early years in Monett, Mo., area. After his parents divorced, he moved with his father to Asherville when he was eight years old. He attended grade school in Asherville and then graduate in Simpson from high school.

After graduation he and two friends followed wheat harvest from Texas to South Dakota. He worked for Boeing aircraft for about a year and then joined the National Guard for a tour of duty. Following his training with the National Guard he went to work by the J. M. McDonald Co. at Corcordia. Later he was transferred to the store in Minden, Neb.

On Sept. 2, 1962, he and Merna Bloomfield were married in Minden, Neb., with Merna's sister and brother-in-law, Alice and Don Bates.

In March 1963 he was transferred to Goodland; in March 1966 he was transferred to McCook, Neb.; in March 1967 to Burlington; and in July 1974 to Ulysses.

In 1977, the couple opened the Fashion Corner in Burlington which they operated until 1980, at which

time they purchased the Montgomery Ward Catalog Sales store in Burlington. In 1982 they sold the Montgomery Ward store and then he was manager at Burlington Manor.

Mr. Carlin was a member of the First Christian Church in Burlington. He was a member of the Prairie Carriage Club during its existence. For 15 years the couple were charter members of the Flatlander Sams camping group.

Preceding him in death were his parents.

Survivors include his wife of nearly 50 years; two sons, Greg (Jana) Carlin and Grant (Leann) Carlin; a daughter, Pam Carlin; a brother, Jerry (Elaine) Carlin of Searcy, Ark.; seven grandchildren; and a great-grandson.

The Sherman County Conservation District will conduct a sign-up June 18-29 for both Non Point and State Water Resources Cost Share Program

Some of the State Water Resources Cost Share Program practices eligible for cost share include Contour Buffer Strips, Critical Area Planting, Diversions, Fencing, Grassed Waterways, Pipelines, Terraces, Livestock Wells and Tanks. Windbreaks have been added but are a lower priority. Most practices in the State Cost Share program are cost shared at 70% of average cost. The landowner limit is \$6,000. The Non-Point source funds can be used for FAILING on site waste water systems and plugging abandoned wells. LEPA will have to evaluate and rank the applications and there will be a \$300 fee up front for these services. The cost share rates are limited to 50% not exceed \$2,500 on septic systems and 50% not to exceed \$500 on abandoned wells.
