The Sherman County Conservation District will conduct a sign-up June 18-29 for both Non Point and State Water **Resources Cost Share Program**

Some of the State Water Resources Cost Share Program practices eligible for cost share include Contour Buffer Strips, Critical Area Planting, Diversions, Fencing, Grassed Waterways, Pipelines, Terraces, Livestock Wells and Tanks. Windbreaks have been added but are a lower priority. Most practices in the State Cost Share program are cost shared at 70% of average cost. The landowner limit is \$6,000. The Non-Point source funds can be used for FAILING on site waste water systems and plugging abandoned wells. LEPG will have to evaluate and rank the applications and there will be a \$300 fee up front for these services. The cost share rates are limited to 50% not exceed \$2,500 on septic systems and 50% not to exceed \$500 on abandoned wells.
