

Alvin Eugene McCall

Lifelong Sherman County, Kansas resident Alvin Eugene McCall, 94, passed away Tuesday, February 28, 2012, at Good Samaritan Society— Sherman County in Goodland.

He was born December 13, 1917, in a sod house northwest of Ruleton, Kansas, the son of Ross and Edith (Harding) McCall. He grew up on the farm, attending eight years of elementary school three miles from the homestead. In 1935, he graduated om Sherman Community High School as Salutatorian of his class. Upon graduation, he went to the University of Colorado, majoring in physical education and participating in various sports. At CU, he earned the rare distinction of being a three sport letterman in football, gymnastics, and baseball. In the 1937-38 season, his football team participated in the second ever Cotton Bowl, in which Colorado was one of the top rated teams in the country, given the fact that there were only four bowl games during that era. Alvin had the privilege of playing with the legendary Byron Whizzer" White, who was the top pick in the upcoming NFL draft and later served as a US Supreme Court Justice. The story has it that the two academically inclined teammates often spent time studying together. After graduating from CU, Alvin made his way back to Northwest Kansas, teaching and coaching at Jennings for two years. At Jennings, he was the head football coach, implementing a single wing offense, where the entire backfield would go in motion to create an advantage before the opposing team could adjust. His successful system was later outlawed. During World War II, he was drafted and he honorably served in the United States Army Air Corps as a 1st Lieutenant, which included duties as a physical training officer. Alvin often spoke of his four year military experience, serving twenty-six months in England, France, and Germany. At the end of the war, he went back to college, attending the University of Northern Colorado. During his time there, one of the coaches mentioned that they were giving the veterans an extra year of eligibility, so Alvin played a fifth year of baseball.

ed in marriage on August 15, 1949, and this union brought forth six children.

In 1949, Alvin moved to the High School, where he taught several classes, including chemistry, general math, and mechanical drawing. One year later, Alvin served as the head wrestling coach. Several years later, he took over the physical education program at Goodland High School. During his time as a physical educator, he was an exemplary teacher, conducting classes that encouraged maximum participation of his students. During the early years, he would have a yearly PE program at the field house, enjoyed by members of the community. This event often produced large crowds. His students would perform many amazing gymnastic routines. During his sixteen years of coaching wrestling, Alvin had numerous state champions, was one of the early pioneers in establishing the wrestling programs in Northwest Kansas, and was a major contributor in writing the book

During his younger years, he enjoyed playing on a championship softball team with five of his uncles, and years later, played on a team with the teachers.
