Sarita Margaret (Hooker) Chandler, 97, Burlington homemaker, died Thursday, March 1, 2012, at Good Samaritan Society in Goodland.

She was born June 21, 1914 to Richard H. and Anna I. (Weir) Hooker on their homestead 12 miles south of Otis, Colo. Mrs. Chandler went to the Victor School in Washington County, Colo., graduating from the eighth grade in 1928. She attended High Prairie High School, 25 miles from her home with her brothers. She left school in 1929 when her brothers started working the the sugar beet fields and she no longer had transportation to and from the high school.

Her first job was helping a neighbor slaughter and dress ducks. In 1932 she worked as a caregiver for an elderly woman in northwest Denver. In 1934 she returned home to her parents' farm south of Otis to care for her ill mother.

On April 11, 1942, she and Clarence Aaron Chandler were married in Goodland. The couple lived on the Rell Morrow Ranch northeast of Burlington. In the fall of 1978 they retired and moved to Burlington.

Mrs. Chandler loved gardening, babysitting for the Young Mothers of Burlington and taking short trips

with her husband to visit friends or go fishing. She enjoyed embroidery, handiwork of all kinds and gathering information about her ancestors.

Preceding her in death were her husband; her parents; five brothers, Clarence Robert Hooker, Lawrence Woodrow Hooker, Wilson Weir Hooker, Robert Winfield Hooker and Nile Everett Hooker; two sisters, Wilma Fern Spangler and Clara June Spears; and an infant granddaughter, Crissine Joy Rico.
