

### Former Goodland coach wins Colorado 5A state title By Karen Krien He competed in the Junior Fargo Year Award.

karen.k@nwkansas.com The Pine Creek High School wrestling team, lead by former Goodland High School wrestling coach Billy Gabel, claimed the Colorado 5A state title on Feb. 18.

Eight of the Pine Creek wrestlers placed at the state tournament, one taking first, three in second place, two third place winners, one fourth and one sixth.

Following the announcement of the team's championship title, he was named 5A Coach of the Year. On Monday, Feb. 20, he received a phone call informing him that he was selected as the Coach of the Year for the state of Colorado in Physical Education. in all classifications (2A, 3A, 4A and 5A).

In the fall, Gabel, who is originally from St. Francis, was inducted into the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Gabel knew what it was like to be a champion wrestler, having taken state four times - a feat claimed by few. He finished his high school career with 125 wins and 5 losses. He was named Senior 3-2-1A Wrestler of the Year and was the 1996 Kansas Wrestler of the Year.

All Americans for two years placing fifth in Greco Roman the first year and seventh the second year. He was a four-time Junior Regional National Champion and was named Outstanding Wrestler in 1996 at the Rocky Mountain Regionals. Gabel was also featured in the 1996 Sports Illustrated magazine.

After high school, he was recruited by the University of Nebraska at Lincoln and wrestled there from icans. 1996-1999. He then transferred to Oklahoma State University to wrestle with his brother, Kelly Gabel. He wrestled at OSU from 1999-2001 where he graduated with his degree

coaching in Goodland from 2001-2002. He went on to teach and coach at Pine Creek High School in Gabel, Colby. Larry Gabel, now Colorado Springs. He was the assistant wrestling coach there from 2002 - 2007 and was named the head wrestling coach in 2008.

As a first time head coach for Pine Creek High School, Gabel's team placed 30th in the state. His second year as head coach, the team placed second in the state where Gabel was honored with the 5A Coach of the

His third year they placed seventh in the state, and last year his team took a third place finish at the state tournament. In the five years he has been the head wrestling coach, he has had 24 state placers and-or champions, two two-time state champions, five High School National All-Americans, one Senior National third place All-American. and six Fargo National All-Amer-

Gabel said he believes that athletics, coaching and life are summed up in a couple of sentences: "You have to be willing to sacrifice to achieve something great! Staying strong in your faith in the Lord and He then began teaching and trusting His lead in your life will always be worth while."

Gabel is the son of Larry and Beth principal at Colby High School, was the head wrestling coach in St. Francis for 32 years. In 2005, Larry received the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association Hall of Fame Award and just last year was inducted into the Kansas Activities Association Hall of Fame.
